4. Title Interstate Compact for the Supervision of Adult Offenders

5. Summary/Purpose:

To establish uniform procedures for accepting and supervising offenders on probation and parole for offenses who want to move across state lines, states have established an interstate compact. The proposed legislation would authorize the Commonwealth to join a new compact that has been established to replace the one that had been in effect since 1937.

6. Fiscal Impact: Final. See Item 8.

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

8. Fiscal implications:

Forty-seven other states have joined the new compact. If Virginia does not join, the Department of Corrections will be significantly hampered in its dealings with other states related to the supervision of offenders on probation and parole. It is estimated that the additional cost to the Department of Corrections resulting from joining the new compact will be approximately \$30,000, which can be absorbed in the department's current appropriation.
