4. Title Carrying weapon in air carrier airport terminal.

5. Summary/Purpose:

Provides that it is a Class 1 misdemeanor for any person to possess or transport into any air carrier airport terminal in the Commonwealth any (i) gun or other weapon designed or intended to propel a missile or projectile of any kind, (ii) frame, receiver, muffler, silencer, missile, projectile or ammunition designed for use with a dangerous weapon and (iii) any other dangerous weapon, including explosives, tasers, stun weapons and those weapons specified in subsection A of §18.2-308. This prohibition does not apply to law-enforcement officers, conservators of the peace employed by the airport, or any passenger of an airline who transports a lawful firearm into or out of an air carrier airport terminal to present such firearm to U.S. Customs agents, check the firearm with his luggage, or retrieve the firearm from the baggage claim area.

8. Fiscal implications:

Anyone convicted of a Class I misdemeanor is subject to a sentence of up to 12 months in jail and a maximum fine of \$2,500. There is not enough information available to reliably estimate how many additional inmates in jail could result from this proposal. Any increase in jail population will increase costs to the state. The Commonwealth pays the localities \$8.00 a day for each misdemeanant or otherwise local responsible prisoner held in a jail. It also funds the majority of the jails' operating costs, e.g. correctional officers. The state's share of these costs varies from locality to locality. According to the Compensation Board's most recent Jail Cost Report (FY 2002), the estimated total state support for local jails averaged \$29.80 per inmate, per day in FY 2002.
