10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That § 46.2-896 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 46.2-896. Duties of driver in event of accident involving damage only to unattended property. The driver of any vehicle involved in an accident in which no person is killed or injured, but in
13 14	which an unattended vehicle or other unattended property is damaged, shall make a reasonable effort to
14	find the owner or custodian of such property and shall report to the owner or custodian the information
16	which the driver is required to report pursuant to § 46.2-894 if such owner or custodian is found. If the
17	owner or custodian of such damaged vehicle or property cannot be found, the driver shall leave a note
18	or other sufficient information including driver identification and contact information in a conspicuous
19	place at the scene of the accident and shall report the accident in writing within twenty-four 24 hours to
20	the State Police or the local law-enforcement agency. Such note or other information and written report
21	shall contain the information which that the driver is required to report pursuant to § 46.2-894. The
22	written report shall, in addition, state the date, time, and place of the accident and the driver's estimate
23	complete description of the property damage.
24	Where, because of injuries sustained in the accident, the driver is prevented from complying with the

foregoing provisions of this section, the driver shall, as soon as reasonably possible, make the required report to the State Police or local law-enforcement agency and make a reasonable effort to locate the owner or custodian of the unattended vehicle or property and report to him the information required by § 46.2-894.
