3	A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-202 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Pledge of Allegiance

10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 22.1-202 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 22.1-202. Instruction in history and principles of flags of United States and Virginia; Pledge of
13	Allegiance to American flag; guidelines developed by the Board.
14	A. Instruction in the history and principles of the flag of the United States and the flag of the
15	Commonwealth shall be given in one or more grades in every school division. The instruction shall
16	include the pledge of allegiance Pledge of Allegiance and the appropriate etiquette and conventions for
17	respecting the dignity and appropriate display of such flags.
18	In recognition of the civic heritage of the United States of America, all students shall be required to
19	learn the Pledge of Allegiance and to demonstrate such knowledge.
20	B. To promote compliance with constitutional restrictions as well as observance of constitutional
21	rights, the Board of Education shall, in consultation with the Office of the Attorney General, develop
22	guidelines on constitutional rights and restrictions relating to the recitation of the pledge of allegiance
23	Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag in public schools.
24	The Board's guidelines shall include, but shall not be limited to, provisions which that address the
25	following: the initiative and involvement of local school boards, individual schools, administrators,
26	teachers, and students; the propriety and constitutionality of any recitation or participation requirements,
27	including parental notification [ or consent ] for minor students who decline to stand or to recite the
28	<i>pledge</i> ; appropriate etiquette and conventions for respecting the dignity and appropriate display of the
<b>29</b>	flag of the United States and the flag of the Commonwealth; and relevant state and federal constitutional
30	concerns, such as freedom of speech and religion.
31	These guidelines shall not be subject to the requirements of the Administrative Process Act
32	(§ 2.2-4000 et seq.). However, to provide appropriate opportunity for involvement by the general public,
33	teachers, and local school boards, the Board of Education shall conduct public hearings prior to
34	establishing such guidelines. Thirty days prior to conducting such hearings, the Board shall give written
35	notice by mail of the date, time, and place of the hearings to all local school boards and any other
36	persons requesting to be notified of the hearings and publish notice of its intention to hold such hearings
37	in the Virginia Register of Regulations. Interested parties shall be given reasonable opportunity to be
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30 39	heard and present information prior to the adoption of such guidelines. C. Each school board shall require the daily recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance in each classroom

	of the school division and shall ensure that the flag of the United States is in place in each such
41 42	classroom. Each school board shall determine the appropriate time during the school day for the
	recitation of the Pledge. During such Pledge of Allegiance, students shall stand and recite the Pledge
43	while facing the flag with their right hands over their hearts or in an appropriate salute if in uniform;
<b>44</b>	however, no student shall be compelled to recite the Pledge if he [, or ] his parent or legal guardian
45	objects on religious, philosophical or other grounds to his participating in this exercise. Students who are
46	thus exempt from reciting the Pledge shall remain quietly standing or sitting at their desks while others
47	recite the Pledge and shall make no display that disrupts or distracts others who are reciting the Pledge.
48	School boards shall provide appropriate accommodations for students who are unable to comply with the
<b>49</b>	procedures described herein due to disability.
50	The school board's code of conduct shall apply to disruptive behavior during the recitation of the
51	Pledge in the same manner as provided for other circumstances of such behavior.
52	D. The Office of the Attorney General shall intervene on behalf of local school boards and shall
53	provide legal defense of the provisions of this section.
