11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 32.1-111.4 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
13	§ 32.1-111.4. Regulations; emergency medical services personnel and vehicles; response times;
14	enforcement provisions; civil penalties.
15	A. The State Board of Health shall prescribe by regulation:
16	1. Requirements for record keeping, supplies, operating procedures and other agency operations;
17	2. Requirements for the sanitation and maintenance of emergency medical services vehicles and their
18	medical supplies and equipment;
19	3. Procedures, including the requirements for forms, to authorize qualified emergency medical
20	services personnel to follow Do Not Resuscitate Orders pursuant to § 54.1-2987.1;
21	4. Requirements for the composition, administration, duties and responsibilities of the State
22	Emergency Medical Services Advisory Board;
23 24	5. Requirements, developed in consultation with the Emergency Medical Services Advisory Board, governing the <i>training</i> , certification, and recertification of emergency medical services personnel;
24 25	6. Requirements for written notification to the State Emergency Medical Services Advisory Board,
2 3 2 6	the State Office of Emergency Medical Services, and the Financial Assistance and Review Committee of
2 7	the Board's action, and the reasons therefor, on requests and recommendations of the Advisory Board,
28	the State Office of Emergency Medical Services or the Committee, no later than five workdays after
29	reaching its decision, specifying whether the Board has approved, denied, or not acted on such requests

32	Advisory Board, which allow the possession and administration of epinephrine or a medically accepted
33	equivalent for emergency cases of anaphylactic shock by certain levels of certified emergency medical

35	8. A uniform definition of "response time" and requirements, developed in consultation with the
36 37	Emergency Medical Services Advisory Board, for each agency to measure response times starting from the time a call for amergency medical earner is received until the time an appropriate amergency medical
37 38	the time a call for emergency medical care is received until the time an appropriate emergency medical response unit arrives on the scene, and requirements for agencies to collect and report such data to the
39	Director of the Office of Emergency Medical Services who shall compile such information and make it
40	available to the public, upon request; and
41	9. Enforcement provisions, including, but not limited to, fines that the Commissioner may assess
42	against any person, agency, or other entity found to be in violation of any of the provisions of this
43	article or any regulation promulgated under this article. Such provisions shall be subject to the
44	Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.).
45	B. The Board shall classify agencies and emergency medical services vehicles by type of service
46	rendered and shall specify the medical equipment, the supplies, the vehicle specifications and the

48 40	C. In formulating its regulations, the Board shall consider the current Minimal Equipment List for
49	Ambulances adopted by the Committee on Trauma of the American College of Surgeons.

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
