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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact §§ 23-9.2:3, 23-9.6:1, and 23-9.14:2 of the Code of Virginia and to 3 amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 23-9.2:3.02, relating to enrollment of 4 certain community college students in four-year public institutions of higher education.

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Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

9 1. That §§ 23-9.2:3, 23-9.6:1, and 23-9.14:2 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted 10 and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 23-9.2:3.02 as follows:

Approved

§ 23-9.2:3. Power of governing body of educational institution to establish rules and regulations; 11 12 offenses occurring on property of institution; state direct student financial assistance.

A. In addition to the powers now enjoyed by it, the board of visitors or other governing body of 13 14 every educational institution shall have the power:

1. To establish rules and regulations for the acceptance and assistance of students except that (i) 15 individuals who have failed to meet the federal requirement to register for the selective service shall not 16 be eligible to receive any state direct student assistance; and (ii) the accreditation status of a Virginia 17 18 public high school shall not be considered in making admissions determinations for students who have 19 earned a diploma pursuant to the requirements established by the Board of Education; and (iii) the 20 governing boards of the four-year institutions shall establish policies providing for the admission of certain graduates of Virginia community colleges as set forth in § 23-9.2:3.02. 21 22

2. To establish rules and regulations for the conduct of students while attending such institution.

23 3. To establish programs, in cooperation with the State Council of Higher Education and the Office 24 of the Attorney General, to promote compliance among students with the Commonwealth's laws relating 25 to the use of alcoholic beverages.

4. To establish rules and regulations for the rescission or restriction of financial aid, within the 26 27 discretionary authority provided to the institution by federal or state law and regulations, and the 28 suspension and dismissal of students who fail or refuse to abide by such rules and regulations for the 29 conduct of students.

30 5. To establish rules and regulations for the employment of professors, teachers, instructors and all 31 other employees and provide for their dismissal for failure to abide by such rules and regulations. 32

6. To provide parking and traffic rules and regulations on property owned by such institution.

33 7. To establish guidelines for the initiation or induction into any social fraternity or sorority in 34 accordance with § 18.2-56.

35 B. Upon receipt of an appropriate resolution of the board of visitors or other governing body of an 36 educational institution, the governing body of a political subdivision which is contiguous to the 37 institution shall enforce state statutes and local ordinances with respect to offenses occurring on the property of the institution. 38

39 The governing bodies of the public institutions of higher education shall assist the State Council of 40 Higher Education in enforcing the provisions related to eligibility for financial aid.

41 C. In order to improve the quality of the Commonwealth's work force and educational programs, the 42 governing bodies of the public institutions of higher education shall establish programs to seek to ensure 43 that all graduates have the technology skills necessary to compete in the 21st Century and, particularly, 44 that all students matriculating in teacher-training programs receive instruction in the effective use of 45 educational technology.

46 § 23-9.2:3.02. Articulation agreements; admission of certain community college graduates.

Beginning with academic year 2006-2007, the governing board of each four-year public institution of 47 higher education shall develop additional articulation and transfer agreements with uniform application **48** to all institutions within the Virginia Community College System that (i) meet appropriate general 49 50 education and program requirements at the four-year institutions; and (ii) provide additional opportunities for associate degree graduates to be admitted and enrolled. 51

52 The State Council of Higher Education, consistent with its responsibility to facilitate the development of articulation agreements set forth in §§ 23-9.6:1 and 23-9.14:2, shall develop guidelines for such 53 54 agreements. 55

§ 23-9.6:1. Duties of Council generally.

In addition to such other duties as may be prescribed elsewhere, the State Council of Higher 56 57 Education shall have the duty, responsibility and authority:

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7 8 58 1. To prepare plans under which the several state-supported institutions of higher education of 59 Virginia shall constitute a coordinating system. In developing such plans, the Council shall consider the 60 future needs for higher education in Virginia at both the undergraduate and the graduate levels, as well 61 as the mission, programs, facilities and location of each of the existing institutions of higher education, 62 and such other matters as the Council deems appropriate. The Council shall revise such plans at least 63 once every four years and shall submit such recommendations as are necessary for the implementation 64 of the plan to the Governor and the General Assembly.

65 2. To review and approve or disapprove any proposed change in the statement of mission of any 66 presently existing public institution of higher education and to define the mission of all public 67 institutions of higher education created after the effective date of this provision. The Council shall, within the time prescribed in subdivision 1, make a report to the Governor and the General Assembly 68 69 with respect to its actions hereunder. No such actions shall become effective until 30 days after adjournment of the session of the General Assembly next following the filing of such a report. Nothing 70 71 contained in this provision shall be construed to authorize the Council to modify any mission statement 72 adopted by the General Assembly, nor to empower the Council to affect, either directly or indirectly, the 73 selection of faculty or the standards and criteria for admission of any public institution, whether related 74 to academic standards, residence or other criteria; it being the intention of this section that faculty 75 selection and student admission policies shall remain a function of the individual institutions.

3. To study any proposed escalation of any public institution to a degree-granting level higher than
that level to which it is presently restricted and to submit a report and recommendation to the Governor
and the General Assembly relating to the proposal. The study shall include the need for and benefits or
detriments to be derived from the escalation. No such institution shall implement any such proposed
escalation until the Council's report and recommendation have been submitted to the General Assembly
and the General Assembly approves the institution's proposal.

4. To review and approve or disapprove all enrollment projections proposed by each public
institution of higher education. The Council's projections shall be in numerical terms by level of
enrollment and shall be used for budgetary and fiscal planning purposes only. The Council shall develop
estimates of the number of degrees to be awarded by each institution and include those estimates in its
reports of enrollment projections. The student admissions policies for the institutions and their specific
programs shall remain the sole responsibility of the individual boards of visitors.

5. To review and approve or disapprove all new academic programs which any public institution of
higher education proposes. As used herein, "academic programs" include both undergraduate and
graduate programs.

91 6. To review and require the discontinuance of any undergraduate or graduate academic program that 92 is presently offered by any public institution of higher education when the Council determines that such 93 academic program is (i) nonproductive in terms of the number of degrees granted, the number of students served by the program, the program's effectiveness, and budgetary considerations, or (ii) 94 95 supported by state funds and is unnecessarily duplicative of academic programs offered at other public 96 institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth. The Council shall make a report to the Governor 97 and the General Assembly with respect to the discontinuance of any such academic program. No such 98 discontinuance shall become effective until 30 days after the adjournment of the session of the General 99 Assembly next following the filing of such report.

100 7. To review and approve or disapprove the creation and establishment of any department, school, 101 college, branch, division or extension of any public institution of higher education that such institution proposes to create and establish. This duty and responsibility shall be applicable to the proposed creation 102 103 and establishment of departments, schools, colleges, branches, divisions and extensions, whether located 104 on or off the main campus of the institution in question. If any organizational change is determined by 105 the Council to be proposed solely for the purpose of internal management and the institution's curricular 106 offerings remain constant, the Council shall approve the proposed change. Nothing in this provision shall be construed to authorize the Council to disapprove the creation and establishment of any department, 107 108 school, college, branch, division or extension of any institution that has been created and established by the General Assembly. 109

8. To review the proposed closure of any academic program in a high demand or critical shortage area, as defined by the Council, by any public institution of higher education and assist in the development of an orderly closure plan, when needed.

9. To develop a uniform, comprehensive data information system designed to gather all information
necessary to the performance of the Council's duties. The system shall include information on
admissions, enrollments, self-identified students with documented disabilities, personnel, programs,
financing, space inventory, facilities and such other areas as the Council deems appropriate.

117 10. To develop in cooperation with institutions of higher education guidelines for the assessment of 118 student achievement. An institution shall use an approved program that complies with the guidelines of

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119 the Council and is consistent with the institution's mission and educational objectives in the development 120 of such assessment. The Council shall report the institutions' assessments of student achievement in the 121 biennial revisions to the state's master plan for higher education.

122 11. To develop in cooperation with the appropriate state financial and accounting officials and to 123 establish uniform standards and systems of accounting, record keeping and statistical reporting for the 124 public institutions of higher education.

125 12. To review biennially and approve or disapprove all changes in the inventory of educational and 126 general space that any public institution of higher education may propose, and to make a report to the 127 Governor and the General Assembly with respect thereto. No such change shall be made until 30 days 128 after the adjournment of the session of the General Assembly next following the filing of such report.

129 13. To visit and study the operations of each of the public institutions of higher education at such 130 times as the Council shall deem appropriate and to conduct such other studies in the field of higher 131 education as the Council deems appropriate or as may be requested by the Governor or the General 132 Assembly.

133 14. To provide advisory services to private, accredited and nonprofit institutions of higher education, 134 whose primary purpose is to provide collegiate or graduate education and not to provide religious 135 training or theological education, on academic, administrative, financial and space utilization matters. 136 The Council may also review and advise on joint activities, including contracts for services between 137 such public and private institutions of higher education or between such private institutions and any 138 agency of the Commonwealth or political subdivision thereof.

139 15. To adopt such rules and regulations as the Council believes necessary to implement all of the 140 Council's duties and responsibilities as set forth in this Code. The various public institutions of higher 141 education shall comply with such rules and regulations.

142 16. To issue guidelines consistent with the provisions of the federal Family Education Rights and 143 Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 U.S.C. § 1232g requiring public institutions of higher education to release a 144 student's academic and disciplinary record to a student's parent.

145 17. To develop and revise, as it deems necessary, in consultation with the Coordinator of Emergency 146 Management, a model institutional crisis and emergency management plan for the purpose of assisting 147 public and private two-year and four-year institutions of higher education in establishing, operating, and 148 maintaining emergency services and disaster preparedness activities.

149 18. To require that each institution of higher education formed, chartered, or established in the 150 Commonwealth after July 1, 1980, shall ensure the preservation of student transcripts in the event of 151 institutional closure or revocation of approval to operate in the Commonwealth of Virginia. An 152 institution may provide for the preservation of student transcripts by binding agreement with another 153 institution of higher education with which it is not corporately connected or in such other way as the 154 Council may authorize by regulation. In the event an institution closes, or has its approval to operate in 155 the Commonwealth revoked, the Council, through its Director, may take such action as is necessary to 156 secure and preserve the student transcripts until such time as an appropriate institution accepts all or 157 some of the transcripts. Nothing in this section shall be deemed to interfere with the right of a student 158 to his own transcripts; nor shall this section authorize disclosure of student records except as may 159 otherwise be authorized by law.

160 19. To develop, in cooperation with the institutions of higher education, the Board of Nursing, and 161 the Advisory Council on the Future of Nursing in Virginia, a strategic statewide plan to ensure an 162 adequate supply of nurses. The Council shall recommend to the Governor and the General Assembly 163 such changes in public policy as may be necessary to meet the state's current and future need for 164 essential nursing services.

165 20. To facilitate the development of dual admissions and articulation agreements between two- and four-year public and private institutions of higher education in Virginia. Such agreements shall be 166 subject to the admissions requirements of the four-year institutions, except as provided in § 23-9.2:3.02. 167

In carrying out its duties and responsibilities, the Council, insofar as practicable, shall preserve the 168 169 individuality, traditions and sense of responsibility of the respective institutions. The Council, insofar as 170 practicable, shall seek the assistance and advice of the respective institutions in fulfilling all of its duties 171 and responsibilities. 172

§ 23-9.14:2. State Transfer Module.

173 A. The Council shall develop, in cooperation with the governing boards of the public two- and 174 four-year institutions of higher education, a State Transfer Module that designates those general 175 education courses that are offered within various associate degree programs at the public two-year 176 institutions that are transferable for credit or admission with standing as a junior (third year) to the 177 public four-year institutions.

178 In developing such Module, the Council shall also seek the participation of private institutions of 179 higher education in the Commonwealth.

180 B. The Council shall also facilitate the development of dual admissions and articulation agreements
181 between the Commonwealth's public and private two- and four-year institutions of higher education.
182 Such agreements shall be subject to the admissions requirements of the four-year institutions.

183 The Council shall also develop guidelines for the articulation agreements required by § 23-9.2:3.02.

184 C. The Council shall develop and make available to the public information identifying (i) all general

185 education courses offered at public two-year institutions and designating those that are accepted for 186 purposes of transfer for course credit at four-year public and private institutions of higher education in

187 Virginia; and (ii) those two- and four-year public institutions that have entered into articulation

188 agreements as required by § 23-9.2:3.02.
