10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Article 2 of Chapter 2 of Title 2.2 a section numbered 2.2-203.2:1 as follows:

13 14	§ 2.2-203.2:1. Performance review of state agencies and programs. A. During the first year of each new gubernatorial administration, the Secretary shall cause to be
14	conducted a performance review of state agencies and programs, focusing on the prioritization of
15 16	program needs, return on program investment, effective program management, and effective, accountable
17	fiscal management of state resources. The performance review shall also examine (i) statewide
18	information technology, (ii) performance-based budgeting and revenue maximization, (iii) personnel
19	management, (iv) acquisition and procurement, (v) health and human services, (vi) public safety, (vii)
20	resource and environmental protection, (viii) economic development and business assistance, and (ix)
21	agency reorganization and consolidation.
22	B. The performance review required by subsection A shall be completed at least once in every
23	three-year period by an independent contractor, the services of whom shall be procured in accordance
24	with the Virginia Public Procurement Act (§ 2.2-4300 et seq.) or the Public-Private Education Facilities

and Infrastructure Act of 2002 (§ 56-575.1 et seq.).
C. Upon completion of the performance review, the results and findings shall be submitted in writing to the Governor and to the General Assembly.
