VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 17.1-802 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the membership of the
3 Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission.

5 Approved 6 7 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 8 1. That § 17.1-802 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 9 § 17.1-802. Membership; terms; compensation and expenses. 10 A. The Commission shall be composed of 17 members as follows: 1. Six judges or justices, who may be judges of a circuit court who regularly hear criminal cases or 11 12 judges or justices of the Supreme Court or the Court of Appeals, to be appointed by the Chief Justice of 13 the Supreme Court of Virginia; 2. One person who is not an active member of the judiciary, to be appointed as Chairman by the 14 15 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Virginia for a term of four years subject to confirmation by the General Assembly. The Chairman shall designate a vice chairman vice chairman from among the other 16 17 members to serve a term commensurate with that of the Chairman; 18 3. Three The Chairman of the House Committee for Courts of Justice or his designee who shall be a 19 *member of the committee and two* persons to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; 20 4. Two persons The Chairman of the Senate Committee for Courts of Justice or his designee who 21 shall be a member of the committee and one person to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; 22 5. Four persons to be appointed by the Governor, at least one of whom shall be a representative of a 23 crime victims' organization or a victim of crime as defined in subsection B of § 19.2-11.01; and 24 6. The Attorney General of Virginia or his designee for a term commensurate with his term of office. 25 All members shall be citizens of the Commonwealth. B. Except for legislative members and gubernatorial appointments, appointments to the Commission 26 27 made on and after January 1, 2001, shall be for terms of four years. Legislative members shall serve 28 terms coincident with their terms of office. Appointments to the Commission made by the Governor on 29 and after January 1, 2006, shall be for terms of four years. Members initially appointed to the 30 Commission prior to January 1, 1998, may serve no more than three consecutive terms. Members 31 initially appointed on and after January 1, 1998, shall not be eligible to serve more than two consecutive 32 terms except for the Attorney General who shall serve by virtue of his office. Vacancies occurring other 33 than by expiration of a term shall be filled for the unexpired term. Vacancies shall be filled in the same 34 manner as the original appointments. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed to fill 35 a vacancy or the service of an initial term of three years or less shall not constitute a term in 36 determining the member's eligibility for reappointment.

C. Members Legislative members of the Commission shall receive compensation as provided in \$37 § 30-19.12 and nonlegislative citizen members of the Commission shall receive compensation as provided in § 2.2-2813 and all members shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the costs of compensation and expenses of the members shall be provided by the Virginia Sentencing 40 Commission.

43 2. That the provisions of this act shall not be construed to affect existing appointments for which 44 the terms have not expired or for which there is no vacancy. However, any new appointments

45 made after July 1, 2005, shall be made in accordance with the provisions of this act.
