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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 4.1-119 of the Code of Virginia, relating to alcoholic beverage control; 3 purchases by certain licensees.

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Approved

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That § 4.1-119 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

§ 4.1-119. Operation of government stores.

A. Subject to the requirements of §§ 4.1-121 and 4.1-122, the Board may establish, maintain and 10 operate government stores for the sale of alcoholic beverages, other than beer and wine not produced by 11 farm wineries, vermouth, and mixers, in such counties, cities, and towns considered advisable by the 12 13 Board. The Board may discontinue any such store.

B. The Board shall fix the wholesale and retail prices at which the various classes, varieties and 14 15 brands of alcoholic beverages are sold in government stores. Differences in the cost of operating stores, and market competition and conditions may be reflected in the sale price of alcoholic beverages sold at 16 government stores. The Board may sell alcoholic beverages to federal instrumentalities (i) authorized and 17 operating under the laws of the United States and regulations of the United States Department of 18 19 Defense and (ii) located within the boundaries of federal enclaves or reservations over which the United 20 States has acquired jurisdiction, at prices which may be greater or less than the wholesale price charged 21 other authorized purchasers.

22 C. Alcoholic beverages at government stores shall be sold by employees of the Board, who shall 23 carry out the provisions of this title and Board regulations governing the operation of government stores 24 and the sale of alcoholic beverages.

25 D. No Class 1 neutral grain spirit or alcohol, as defined by federal regulations, that is without 26 distinctive character, aroma, taste or color shall be sold in government stores at a proof greater than 101 27 except upon permits issued by the Board for industrial, commercial, culinary, or medical use.

28 E. All alcoholic beverages sold in government stores shall be in closed containers, sealed and affixed 29 with labels prescribed by the Board. 30

F. No alcoholic beverages shall be consumed in a government store by any person.

31 G. With respect to purchases by licensees at government stores, the Board shall (i) accept in payment 32 for any purchase or series of purchases cash, electronic fund transfer, credit or debit card, or check 33 payable to the Board, in the exact amount of any such purchase or series of purchases and (ii) provide 34 notice to licensees on Board policies relating to the assignment of government stores from which 35 licensees may purchase products and any procedure for the licensee to elect to make purchases from an 36 alternative government store.

37 H. With respect to purchases by consumers at government stores, the Board shall accept cash in payment for any purchase or series of purchases. The Board may adopt regulations which provide for 38 39 accepting a credit card or debit card as payment. Such regulations may provide for the collection, where 40 appropriate, of related fees, penalties and service charges for the use of a credit card or debit card by
