That § 22.1-253.13:4 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 22.1-253.13:4. Standard 4. Diplomas and certificates; class rankings. 11 A. Each local school board shall award diplomas to all secondary school students, including students 12 13 who transfer from nonpublic schools or from home instruction, who earn the units of credit prescribed 14 by the Board of Education, pass the prescribed tests, and meet such other requirements as may be prescribed by the local school board and approved by the Board of Education. 15 In addition, the Board of Education shall establish guidelines for local school boards to award 16 alternative diplomas for which 22 credits and satisfactory completion of coursework are required, but 17 for which no verified units of credit are required. School boards shall report annually to the Board of 18 Education the number of such diplomas awarded. In no event shall the issuance of such diplomas be 19 20 considered in determinations of school accreditation. 21 Provisions shall be made for students who transfer between secondary schools and from nonpublic 22 schools or from home instruction as outlined in the standards for accreditation. Further, reasonable 23 accommodation to meet the requirements for diplomas shall be provided for otherwise qualified students 24 with disabilities as needed. 25 In addition, each local school board may devise, vis-a-vis the award of diplomas to secondary school 26 students, a mechanism for calculating class rankings that takes into consideration whether the student has 27 taken a required class more than one time and has had any prior earned grade for such required class 28 expunged. 29 B. Students identified as disabled who complete the requirements of their individualized education 30 programs shall be awarded special diplomas by local school boards. 31 C. Students who have completed a prescribed course of study as defined by the local school board shall be awarded certificates by local school boards if they do not qualify for diplomas. 32 33 D. The Board of Education shall develop criteria for recognizing exemplary performance in career 34 and technical education programs by students who have completed the requirements for a standard or 35 advanced studies diploma and shall award seals on the diplomas of students meeting such criteria. 36 E. By September 1, 2003, the Board shall establish, by regulation, requirements for the award of a general achievement diploma for those persons who have (i) achieved a passing score on the GED examination; (ii) successfully completed an education and training program designated by the Board of
