[HJR 541], Frederick [HJR 550], Black [HJR 562], Fralin [HJR 563], Marshall, R.G. [HJR 585], Plum [HJRs 642 and 644], Sickles [HJR 717], and Albo [HJR 771]) 8 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Virginia by adding in Article X a section numbered 9 7-B, relating to special funds for transportation purposes. RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, a majority of the members elected to 10 11 each house agreeing, That the following amendment to the Constitution of Virginia be, and the same hereby is, proposed and referred to the General Assembly at its first regular session held after the next 12 general election of members of the House of Delegates for its concurrence in conformity with the 13 provisions of Section 1 of Article XII of the Constitution of Virginia, namely: 14 15 Amend the Constitution of Virginia by adding in Article X a section numbered 7-B as follows: 16 **ARTICLE X** TAXATION AND FINANCE 17 Section 7-B. Transportation Funds. 18 (a) The General Assembly shall maintain permanent and separate Transportation Funds. 19 The 20 Commonwealth Transportation Fund, Transportation Trust Fund, Highway Maintenance and Operating 21 Fund, any other Fund established by general law for transportation, and all subsidiary accounts and 22 parts thereof, shall be deemed Transportation Funds for purposes of this section. (b) There shall be deposited to the Transportation Funds all revenues dedicated to the 23 24 Transportation Funds under provisions of general law, but excluding a general appropriation law, in 25 effect on January 1, 2005. However, the General Assembly may by general law, but excluding a general 26 appropriation law, make changes to the revenues dedicated and paid into the Transportation Funds. 27 Money in the Transportation Funds may be invested as authorized by law. 28 (c) The General Assembly shall appropriate Transportation Funds only for purposes of (i) financing, 29 acquiring, constructing, improving, maintaining, and operating transportation systems in the 30 Commonwealth, and all purposes incidental thereto; (ii) furthering the interests of the Commonwealth in highways, public transportation, railways, seaports, and airports; and (iii) providing for the operations 31 32 of state agencies related to transportation. 33 (d) The General Assembly may borrow from Transportation Funds for other purposes only by a vote 34 equal to or greater than two-thirds plus one of the members voting in each house, including a majority 35 of the members elected to that house. The name of each member voting and how he voted shall be 36 recorded in the journal of each house. Any amount borrowed shall be repaid to the Transportation 37 Funds, with reasonable interest, not later than the end of the fourth full fiscal year following the 38 effective date of the borrowing.
