Directing the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission to study the feasibility of establishing a new class of driver's license for drivers without proof of legal presence in the United States.

WHEREAS, current Virginia law does not allow the issuance of driver's licenses to those without proof of legal presence in the United States; and

WHEREAS, some drivers on Virginia roads are unlicensed and do not currently qualify for licenses; and

WHEREAS, the state of Virginia would benefit in reducing the percentage of uninsured motorists and with safer roads; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission be directed to study the feasibility of establishing a new class of driver's license for drivers without proof of legal presence in the United.
