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## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

- An Act to amend and reenact §§ 15.2-6300, 15.2-6301, 15.2-6302, 15.2-6304, 15.2-6306, 15.2-6308 and 2 15.2-6319 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding sections numbered 15.2-6300.1, 15.2-6308.1, 15.2-6314.1 and by adding in Chapter 63 of Title 15.2 a section numbered 3 4 5
- 15.2-6322, relating to development of former federal areas.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

9 10 1. That §§ 15.2-6300, 15.2-6301, 15.2-6302, 15.2-6304, 15.2-6306, 15.2-6308 and 15.2-6319 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding 11 sections numbered 15.2-6300.1, 15.2-6308.1, 15.2-6314.1 and by adding in Chapter 63 of Title 15.2 12 13 a section numbered 15.2-6322 as follows:

Approved

§ 15.2-6300. Declaration of policy for authorities created by the Governor.

15 This legislation is enacted to provide for the acquisition by political subdivisions of areas which have been or may hereafter be occupied as United States government military installations and which are 16 disposed of by the United States government. The industrial and economic development of localities 17 included in or adjacent to such military installations and the tax revenues of the Commonwealth will be 18 19 seriously affected by the manner in which such areas are returned to nonmilitary uses and to the tax 20 rolls, no provision having been made therefor. The proper development of such areas industrially and otherwise is required so that local governments may derive revenues with which to render necessary 21 22 services to their citizens and so that industrial development; job creation; and housing, recreational, 23 commercial, educational and other economic and social development may be fostered and stimulated to 24 prevent the creation of blighted areas in the Commonwealth with resultant injury to all. The creation by 25 this chapter and operation of such authorities hereunder pursuant to this chapter are governmental 26 functions of the gravest concern to the Commonwealth and the need for this enactment being a matter of 27 legislative policy such need is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination. 28

§ 15.2-6300.1. Declaration of policy for authorities created by a locality.

29 It is further found and declared that: It being the policy of the federal government to promote the 30 development of federal employee housing, including military housing, office buildings and other infrastructure through partnerships with private and governmental entities, the purpose of such 31 32 transactions being to help the federal government get needed infrastructure in place more quickly, and 33 to increase the value of its installations, the creation and operation of the authorities by a locality and 34 the granting to such an authority of the powers set forth under this chapter are necessary for the public 35 welfare, to enable more efficient cooperation with the federal government, and to increase the value of 36 federal installations in the Commonwealth.

37 § 15.2-6301. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, unless the context or subject matter requires otherwise:

39 "Adjacent to such authority" includes real or personal property which is contiguous, neighboring, or 40 within reasonable proximity of an authority.

41 "Area of operation" means an area coextensive with the territorial boundaries of the land acquired 42 from the federal government by the authority.

43 "Authority" means any political subdivision created by this chapter. The terms "an authority" or "the 44 authority" refer to each such authority.

45 "Bonds" means any bonds, notes, interim certificates, debentures, or other obligations issued by an 46 authority pursuant to this chapter. 47

"Commissioners" means the members of the board of commissioners of an authority.

"Facility" means a particular building or structure or particular buildings or structures, including all **48** 49 equipment, appurtenances and accessories necessary or appropriate for the operation of such facility.

50 Federal area" means an area coextensive with the territorial boundaries that is, or has been, 51 occupied by a United States governmental activity or operation.

52 "Federal government" includes the United States of America, or any department, agency or 53 instrumentality, corporate or otherwise, of the United States of America.

54 "Former federal area" means an area coextensive with the territorial boundaries which that is, or has 55 been, occupied by a United States governmental military installation and which is, or appears likely to 56 be, subject to disposal by the United States government to public bodies, or otherwise.

57 "Obligee of the authority" or "obligee" includes any bondholder, trustee or trustees for any **SB1189ER** 

bondholders, and the federal government when it is a party to any contract with the authority. 58

59 "Person" means as defined in Chapter 2 (§ 1-10 et seq.) of Title 1.

"Project" means any specific enterprise undertaken by an authority, including the facilities as 60 61 hereinafter defined, and all other property, real or personal or any interest therein, necessary or 62 appropriate for the operation of such property.

63 "Public body of the Commonwealth" means any city, town, county, municipal corporation, commission, district, authority, other political subdivision or public body of this Commonwealth. 64

"Real property" means all lands, including improvements and fixtures thereon, and property of any 65 nature appurtenant thereto, or used in connection therewith, and every estate, interest and right, legal or 66 67 equitable, therein, including terms for years and liens by way of judgment, mortgage, or otherwise and 68 the indebtedness secured by such liens. 69

§ 15.2-6302. Establishment of development authorities.

70 With regard to an authority created by the Governor, there is hereby created with respect to every 71 former federal area a political subdivision of the Commonwealth, with such public and corporate powers 72 as are set forth in this chapter. Each such authority shall be designated as the ...... Development 73 Authority (with a name chosen by the Governor descriptive of the area in which the property is located); 74 however, no authority shall exercise any power or transact any business hereunder unless or until the 75 Governor upon receipt of a duly certified resolution of the governing body of each of the localities 76 within the area of operation of an authority requesting such action, shall proclaim that a former federal 77 area exists with respect to which an authority should function under the terms of this chapter. Any such 78 authority for which such a proclamation has been issued may proceed to transact business and to 79 exercise its powers hereunder at any time after the selection of the commissioners of the authority, as 80 set forth in § 15.2-6304.

81 Alternatively, the governing body of the City of Hampton may by ordinance create a development authority for the development or redevelopment of federal areas. The ordinance creating such an 82 authority shall not be adopted or approved until a public hearing has been held on the question of its 83 84 adoption or approval.

85 In any suit, action or proceeding involving the validity or enforcement of or relating to any contract of or action by the authority, the authority shall be conclusively presumed to have been established and 86 87 authorized to transact business and exercise its powers hereunder (i) upon proof of the action of the Governor in issuing a proclamation with reference to such authority and the designation of its name by 88 89 the Governor, which descriptive name can be altered by the authority as may be deemed expedient, or 90 (ii) upon the adoption and approval of an ordinance by the City of Hampton in accordance with this 91 section. 92

§ 15.2-6304. Board of commissioners; appointment of director, agents and employees.

93 A. All powers, rights and duties conferred by this chapter, or other provisions of law, upon an authority created hereunder shall be exercised by a board of commissioners of that authority, hereinafter 94 95 referred to as board or board of commissioners.

B. In the case of authorities created by proclamation of the Governor pursuant to § 15.2-6302, the 96 board shall consist of seven members to be appointed by the Governor, of whom at least five shall be 97 98 residents of the counties locality or localities in which the authority is located. The members shall serve 99 for terms of six years each, the initial appointment to be two members for terms of six years, two members for terms of five years, two members for terms of four years and one member for a term of 100 101 three years, and subsequent appointments to be made for terms of six years, except appointments to fill 102 vacancies which shall be made for the unexpired term.

103 C. In the case of authorities created by the City of Hampton pursuant to § 15.2-6302, the board 104 shall consist of up to seven members appointed by the locality in which the authority is located, all of 105 whom shall be residents of such locality. The members shall serve for terms of not more than four years 106 each. If a member resigns, dies, or is otherwise removed from his position on the board, the locality 107 may appoint a new member to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term.

108 D. Members shall receive from the authority their necessary travel and business expenses while on 109 business of the board. Each commissioner shall before entering on his duties take and subscribe the oath 110 prescribed by § 49-1.

E. The board shall appoint the chief executive officer of the authority, who shall not be a member 111 thereof, to be known as the director of that authority, hereinafter referred to as director, and whose 112 113 compensation shall be paid by the authority in the amount determined by the board. The board shall 114 employ or retain such other agents or employees subordinate to the director as may be necessary. 115 including persons with special qualifications, and shall determine which such agents or employees shall be bonded and the amount of such bonds. The director and other agents and employees so appointed 116 117 shall serve at the pleasure of the board, which shall fix their compensation and prescribe their duties.

The board shall elect from its membership a chairman, vice chairman vice chairman, a secretary and 118

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a treasurer, or secretary-treasurer, and shall prescribe their powers and duties. Four members shall
constitute a quorum of the board for the purpose of conducting its business and exercising its powers
and for all other purposes. The board shall keep detailed minutes of its proceedings, which shall be open
to public inspection. It shall keep suitable records of all of its financial transactions and shall arrange to
have the same audited annually.

124 § 15.2-6306. Principal and branch offices.

The board of each authority created by proclamation of the Governor pursuant to § 15.2-6302 shall
establish a principal office within one of the counties included in the authority. The board may also
establish such branch offices as may be considered by the board to be appropriate to the efficient
operation of the authority.

129 § 15.2-6308. Powers of authorities generally.

130 An authority shall have the following powers:

131 1. To sue and be sued; to adopt and use a common seal and to alter the same as may be deemed
132 expedient; to have perpetual succession; to make and execute contracts and other instruments necessary
133 or convenient to the exercise of the powers of the authority; and to make and from time to time amend
134 and repeal bylaws, rules and regulations, not inconsistent with law, to carry into effect the powers and
135 purposes of the authority.

136 2. To foster and stimulate the industrial, social and other economic development of its area of 137 operation, including without limitation development for industrial, employment, housing, commercial, 138 recreational, educational and other public purposes; to prepare and carry out plans and projects to 139 accomplish such objectives; to provide for the construction, reconstruction, improvement, alteration, maintenance, removal, equipping or repair of any buildings, structures or land of any kind; to sell, lease 140 141 or rent to others or to develop, operate or manage with others in a joint venture or other partnering 142 arrangement, on such terms as it deems proper and which are consistent with the provisions of § 15.2-6317, any lands, dwellings, houses, accommodations, structures, buildings, facilities, or 143 144 appurtenances embraced within its area of operations; to establish, collect and revise the rents charged 145 and terms and conditions of occupancy thereof; to terminate any such lease or rental obligation upon the 146 failure of the lessee or renter to comply with any of the obligations thereof; to arrange or contract for 147 the furnishing by any person or agency, public or private, of works, services, privileges or facilities in 148 connection with any activity in which the authority may engage; to acquire, own, hold, and improve real 149 or personal property; to purchase, lease, obtain options upon, acquire by gift, grant, bequest, devise, 150 easement, dedication or otherwise any real or personal property or any interest therein, which purchase, 151 lease, or acquisition may be made for less than fair market value; to sell, lease, exchange, transfer, 152 assign, or pledge any real or personal property or any interest therein, which sale, lease, or other 153 transfer or assignment may be made for less than fair market value; to dedicate, make a gift of, or lease 154 for a nominal amount, any real or personal property or any interest therein to the Commonwealth, or the 155 localities or agencies, public or private, within the area of operation or adjacent to such authority, jointly 156 or severally, for public use or benefit, such as, but not limited to, game preserves, playgrounds, park and 157 recreational areas and facilities, hospitals, clinics, schools and airports; to acquire, lease, maintain, alter, 158 operate, improve, expand, sell or otherwise dispose of on-site utility and infrastructure systems or sell 159 any excess service capacity for off-site use; to acquire, lease, construct, maintain and operate and 160 dispose of tracks, spurs, crossings, terminals, warehouses and terminal facilities of every kind and 161 description necessary or useful in the transportation and storage of goods, wares and merchandise; and 162 to insure or provide for the insurance of any real or personal property or operation of the authority 163 against any risks or hazards.

164 3. To invest any funds held in reserves or sinking funds, or any funds not required for immediate
165 disbursements, in property or security in which fiduciaries may legally invest funds subject to their
166 control; to purchase its bonds at a price not more than the principal amount thereof and accrued interest,
167 all bonds so purchased to be cancelled.

4. To undertake and carry out examinations, investigations, studies and analyses of the business, 168 169 industrial, agricultural, utility, transportation and other economic development needs, requirements and 170 potentialities of its area of operation, or off-site needs, requirements and potentialities which directly 171 affect the successful industrial and economic development of its area of operation, and the manner in 172 which such needs and requirements and potentialities are being met, or should be met, in order to 173 accomplish the purposes for which it is created; to make use of the facts determined in such research 174 and analyses in its own operation; and to make the results of such studies and analyses available to 175 public bodies and to private individuals, groups and businesses, except as such information may be 176 exempted pursuant to the Virginia Freedom of Information Act (§ 2.2-3700 et seq.).

177 5. In the discharge of its enumerated powers, to cooperate with the federal government, the178 Commonwealth and the localities within its area of operation or adjacent to such authority.

179 6. To appoint an authority advisory committee to advise it, consisting of such number of persons as

180 it may deem proper. Such persons so appointed shall be residents of the localities locality in which the 181 authority is located. They shall not receive any compensation for their services but may be reimbursed 182 for their necessary traveling and other expenses incurred while on business of the authority.

7. To exercise all or any part or combination of powers herein granted.

184 8. To do any and all other acts and things which that may be reasonably necessary and convenient to 185 carry out its purposes and powers.

186 No provision of law with respect to the acquisition, operation or disposition of property by other 187 political subdivisions or public bodies shall be applicable to an authority unless specifically stated 188 therein. In any locality where planning, zoning or development regulations may apply, the authority shall 189 comply with and is subject to those regulations to the same extent as a private commercial or industrial 190 enterprise. 191

§ 15.2-6308.1. Approval of Governor required.

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192 If an authority desires to undertake a project or other activity as provided in this chapter, and the 193 property involved in such undertaking is subject to a reversionary interest in favor of the 194 Commonwealth, such undertaking shall require the prior approval of the Governor but shall not require 195 the approval of any other agency or political subdivision of the Commonwealth. Once the Governor 196 grants such approval, the Commonwealth's reversionary interest in such property shall be subordinate to 197 any lease, mortgage, or other transaction entered into by such authority with regard to such property. 198

§ 15.2-6314.1. Applicability of the Virginia Personnel Act and the Virginia Public Procurement Act. 199 A. Employees of an authority created by a locality shall be exempt from the provisions of the 200 Virginia Personnel Act (§ 2.2-2900 et seq.) if (i) the locality has personnel policies and procedures that 201 are consistent with the goals, objectives, and policies of the Virginia Personnel Act; and (ii) such 202 authority adopts the locality's personnel policies and procedures. In any event, personnel actions shall 203 be taken without regard to race, sex, color, national origin, religion, age, handicap, or political 204 affiliation.

205 B. Any authority created under this chapter shall be subject to the terms of the Virginia Public 206 Procurement Act (§ 2.2-4300 et seq.). Notwithstanding the foregoing, should the United States 207 Department of Defense place a federal area on a list of installations to be closed or realigned under the 208 authority granted to the United States Department of Defense pursuant to the federal Defense Base 209 Closure And Realignment Act of 1990 (United States Public Law 101-501, as amended through the National Defense Authorization Act of Fiscal Year 2003), and such federal area is subject to the 210 jurisdiction of an authority created by a locality, such listing of that installation shall qualify as an 211 212 "emergency" under subsection F of § 2.2-4303 of the Virginia Public Procurement Act. 213

§ 15.2-6319. Dissolution of authority.

214 Whenever the commission of the authority by resolution determines that the purposes for which the authority was formed have been substantially complied with and all bonds issued and all obligations 215 216 incurred by the authority have been fully paid, the commission shall execute and file for record with the 217 governing body or bodies of the localities within the area of operation of locality in which the authority 218 was created, a resolution declaring such facts. If the governing bodies of the localities within the area of 219 operation are of the opinion that the facts stated in the authority's resolution are true and the authority 220 should be dissolved, they shall so resolve; however, in the case of an authority created by proclamation 221 of the Governor pursuant to § 15.2-6302, the authority shall not be dissolved unless or until the 222 Governor, upon receipt of the duly certified resolution of each governing body of each locality within 223 the area of operation of the authority requesting dissolution, shall proclaim that the authority is 224 dissolved. Any such authority for which such a proclamation was issued shall be dissolved as of the 225 date on which the proclamation was issued. Upon such dissolution, the title to all funds and properties 226 owned by the authority at the time of such dissolution shall vest, (i) in the case of authorities created by 227 proclamation of the Governor, in the localities in the area of operation or to not-for-profit agencies, 228 public or private, as may be designated by the localities, or (ii) in the case of authorities created by the 229 City of Hampton pursuant to § 15.2-6302, in such locality or to not-for-profit agencies, public or 230 private, as may be designated by such locality.

231 § 15.2-6322. Sovereign immunity.

232 No provisions of this chapter nor act of an authority, including the procurement of insurance or 233 self-insurance, shall be deemed a waiver of any sovereign immunity to which the authority or its 234 directors, officers, employees, or agents are otherwise entitled.

235 2. That an emergency exists and this act is in force from its passage.
