8 9	Whereas, many older and disabled Americans must make purchase choices relating to essential needs, such as food and medicine, on a daily basis; and
10	Whereas, an estimated one million to two million Americans buy drugs in Canada, where they are up
11	to 50 percent cheaper because of price controls; and
12	Whereas, payment for prescription drugs is the fastest growing segment of health care expenditures
13	in the nation and in the Commonwealth; and
14	Whereas, Illinois, Michigan, Iowa, and Minnesota have joined the I-SaveRx program to facilitate the
15	purchase of prescription drugs from Canada as well as from Ireland and the United Kingdom; and
16	Whereas, Congress has enacted a provision instructing the Secretary of Health and Human Services
17	to implement a waiver process whereby prescription drugs may be purchased from other countries; now,
18	therefore,
19	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
20	1. § 1. Prescription drug purchasing option for citizens of the Commonwealth.
21	In the interest of providing the citizens of the Commonwealth a mechanism for containing pharmacy
22	costs, the Governor shall, immediately upon the issuance of a waiver template or process by the federal
23	Secretary of Health and Human Services, apply for such waiver to establish a mechanism for
24	purchasing reduced-cost prescription drugs from Canada and other countries. The Governor shall, in
25	the exercise of his substantial powers under state law, take all steps necessary for the Commonwealth to
26	join in participating with the states of Illinois, Michigan, Iowa, and Minnesota in the I-SaveRx program,
27	a program for purchasing lower-cost drugs from Canada and other countries, that has already
28 29	developed numerous measures to ensure the quality and safety of the imported drugs. The Governor
29 30	may, when appropriate, sign a memorandum of understanding for Virginia to participate in the I-SaveRx program.
