That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 32.1-323.2 as follows: 32.1-323.2. Department to collect and report on applicants' employment status. 10 A. The Department of Medical Assistance Services shall collect from the Department of Social 11 Services any available information regarding full- or part-time employment of any applicant for health 12 care benefits under public health programs, including the state plan for medical assistance services 13 pursuant to this chapter, the State/Local Hospitalization Program under Chapter 12 (§ 32.1-343 et seq.), 14 and the Family Access to Medical Insurance Security Plan under Chapter 13 (§ 32.1-351 et seq.). In the 15 event the proposed beneficiary is not employed or is a minor, the applicant shall identify the employer 16 of any adult in the household who is responsible for providing all or some of the proposed beneficiary's 17 18 support. 19 B. By November 15 of each year, the Department of Medical Assistance Services shall prepare and 20 submit a summary to the Governor and General Assembly of statistical data on the full- and part-time 21 employment of applicants for public health programs and the costs of such beneficiaries' health care to 22 the Commonwealth. The statistical summary of employment data on applicants for public health 23 programs shall classify Virginia employers by categories, which shall be determined by the Director, 24 and shall not include any personal identifiers, such as, but not limited to, the beneficiaries' names or

25 addresses or health information or the employers' names or locations.

C. For purposes of this section, "proposed beneficiary" means (i) any individual who files an application for health care benefits for himself or (ii) any other individual on whose behalf an application for health care benefits is filed, including children or other dependents of the applicant or other individuals for whom the application is filed.

30 2. That the provisions of this act shall expire on July 1, 2010.

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
