234567 A BILL to direct the State Corporation Commission to analyze the implications of a requirement that it consider imposing a condition, when requested by certain localities, that proposed electrical 8 transmission lines be installed underground. 9

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. § 1. That the State Corporation Commission shall analyze the implications of a requirement that it 10 consider imposing a condition, when requested by certain localities, that proposed electrical 11 transmission lines be installed underground, as follows: 12

A. By January 1, 2006, the State Corporation Commission shall conduct an analysis of the effects on 13 14 all affected persons of an amendment to § 56-46.1 of the Code of Virginia that would:

15 1. Require the Commission, when it considers the effects of an electrical transmission line to be 16 located in any city or county with a population of more than 225,000, based on the latest population estimates of the Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service of the University of Virginia, to consider the 17 impact of such transmission line if it were to be located underground, if requested by the governing 18 19 body of the city or county;

20 2. Authorize the Commission, if it finds that underground location would minimize adverse 21 environmental impact and is otherwise in the public interest, to condition its approval of the electrical 22 transmission line upon the line being located underground; and

23 3. Require the Commission, if it approves the construction of the electrical transmission line without 24 imposing such a condition, to state, in its order approving the construction of the facility, its reason or 25 reasons for declining to impose such a condition.

26 B. The State Corporation Commission shall submit the results of its analysis to the Governor and to 27 the chairmen of the Senate Committee on Commerce and Labor and the House Committee on Commerce 28 and Labor.

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
