4. Title: Consumer Real Estate Settlement Protection Act; limits separate charge

5. Summary/Purpose: The substitute bill prohibits settlement agents from charging, as a separate item on a settlement statement, for complying with requirements that settlement agents collect, maintain, and report to the Department of Taxation information regarding transactions involving the transfer of title to real estate. The provisions do not prohibit a settlement agent from taking into account its costs of complying with the requirements in establishing the charge for closing or settlement services.

6. Fiscal Impact: The bill has no fiscal impact on the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation or the Real Estate Board.
