Summary/Purpose:** This bill provides that principals and division superintendents, in reporting certain serious incidents and crimes for annual recordation and publication by the Department of Education, shall accurately indicate any offenses, arrests, or charges as recorded by law-enforcement authorities and required to be reported by such authorities.
