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- 5. Summary/Purpose: The bill expands the scope of consumer transactions that are subject to the Consumer Protection Act to include home repair transactions, which are transactions in which a person falsely represents that he is a licensed architect, professional engineer, or contractor and undertakes to construct, remove, repair, or improve an owner-occupied dwelling. The measure also makes it a violation of the Act if a person fails to complete the work under a home repair transaction within the time period provided in the agreement with the dwelling's owner or fails to complete the work in a manner that complies with either the Uniform Statewide Building Code or with the terms of the agreement.
- **6. Fiscal impact:** The bill does not have a fiscal impact for either the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services or the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation.
- 7. Budget amendment necessary: No.
- **8. Fiscal implications:** The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services administers the Consumer Protection Act and the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation governs licensing of architects, professional engineers, and contractors. Any workload increase as a result of the bill may be handled within the departments' existing programs and resources.
