5. Summary/Purpose:

Virginia Retirement System; participation by members of a city council. Includes members of a city council of a city participating in the Virginia Retirement System. The bill also allows a member of a city council to continue to receive a retirement allowance based on creditable service for a position other than as a member of city council.

- 7. Budget amendment necessary: No
- **8. Fiscal implications:** The cost of participation of local employees is borne by the individual locality so there is no fiscal impact on the Commonwealth.
- **9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected:** VRS and participating localities.
- 10. Technical amendment necessary: No
 - **11. Other comments:** VRS has several observations related to this bill:
 - This bill would set a precedent by allowing local elected officials, other than Constitutional Officers, to participate in the VRS.
 - Local governing bodies are part time "employees." The bill would also set a precedent by allowing part time local "employees" into the VRS.
 - The bill allows members of city councils, but does not address other elected governing bodies such as boards of supervisors or town councils.
 - Local elected officials who would serve less than five years, e.g. serving only one term, would not meet the vesting requirement.
 - Because of the part time nature of local governing bodies, most members are covered for retirement based on their full time positions.
 - There could be implications for members of local governing bodies who are either current VRS members or retirees.
