4. Title Mental health transition plan.

5. Summary/Purpose:

This legislation proposes to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered [16.1-293.1](#) to require the Board of Juvenile Justice, after consultation with the Board of Mental Health, Mental Retardation, and Substance Abuse Services and other related agencies, to promulgate regulations for the planning and provision of mental health, substance abuse or other therapeutic treatment services for persons returning to the community following commitment to a juvenile correctional center or post-dispositional detention.

6. No Fiscal Impact: Final

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

8. Fiscal implications: The Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) advises that the only cost to the agency would be staff time needed in developing the regulations, which the agency can absorb. Amendments were made in the Senate but DJJ advises these amendments will have no fiscal impact.
