Fiscal implications:** This legislation will expand benefits to Virginia National Guard, Virginia State Defense Force, or naval militia while traveling to the designated place of state active duty. The Department of Military Affairs has confirmed with the Department of Human Resource Management, Office of Workers' Compensation (DHRM/OWC) that this legislation is needed to conform state benefits to match those provided under federal duty situations. In addition, DHRM/OWC reports that the Department of Military Affairs understands that the cost of this increase in coverage is unknown and they are willing to accept any additional premium increases that will result from an increase in claims experienced.
