4. Title Driving under the influence.

5. Summary/Purpose: Clarifies provisions in the driving under the influence laws, particularly in the refusal statute. The bill makes references to DUI manslaughter and DUI maiming consistent throughout the DUI laws. A law-enforcement officer will have to read the refusal form only to persons who refuse to take a blood or breath test.

8. Fiscal implications: The proposed legislation is not expected to have a fiscal impact on state funding. Although the proposed legislation adds DUI manslaughter and DUI maiming to current law, an individual can currently be convicted under other DUI statutes for these same offenses. In addition, the revised language about misdemeanor penalties does not change current penalties or incarceration costs.
