- **4. Title:** State Registrar of Vital Records; compilation of certain marriage, divorce, and annulment information.
- **5. Summary/Purpose:** This bill requires the State Registrar to compile, publish, and make available to the public aggregate data on the number of marriages and divorces or annulments that occur each year in the Commonwealth. The data shall include, but not be limited to, age, and race. In the case of divorce or annulment, the data shall also include the number of minor children involved.

- 7. Budget amendment necessary: Yes. NGF Fund 0215 Vital Records Automation Fund Vital Records and Health Statistics (40400).
- 8. Fiscal implications: Fiscal implications are based on previous experience with the Birth Records Automation Project and assume the use of the Vital Records Automation Fund is allowable. The Division of Vital Records would incur a one-time cost in FY 2005 of approximately \$66,328 for database modifications and equipment necessary to incorporate the applicable vital record information. An additional \$114,940 in data entry temporary staff costs would be necessary in FY 2006 to enter the 5 years (2000-2004) of retroactive data required by the legislation.
