4. Title Reporting of hunting accident; penalty.

5. Summary/Purpose:

Requires any law-enforcement agency or emergency medical service provider that receives a report that a person engaged in hunting has suffered serious bodily injury or death to give notice to the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.

6. No Fiscal Impact.

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

8. Fiscal implications:

The bill requires that any law enforcement-agency or emergency medical service provider that receives a report that a person engaged in hunting has suffered serious bodily injury or death to immediately report the incident to the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries. The bill does not prescribe the manner in which such notice is to be provided. It is not anticipated that the bill will have a fiscal impact.
