4. Title Criminal procedure; criminal records exchange.

5. Summary/Purpose: Requires the law-enforcement agency making a report to the Central Criminal Records Exchange to include within its report, along with the fingerprints, a mug shot of the individual arrested. The Department of State Police and local law enforcement are required to establish written procedures for conducting in-person and photographic lineups.

6. Fiscal Impact Estimates are: PRELIMINARY; See Item 8 below.

7. Budget amendment necessary: Yes; Item 454.

8. Fiscal implications: The Department of State Police estimates that the proposed legislation will require \$1.03 million this biennium with \$212,000 each year thereafter for the administration and support of this system. The estimated costs include defining system requirements, preparation of a request for proposal (RFP), software and hardware, developing integrated solutions with existing systems, annual maintenance costs, and personal services costs for two positions once the system is operational. The estimated time to complete this project is 12 months.

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: All law enforcement agencies statewide.

10. Technical amendment necessary: No.

11. Other comments: Identical to HB 2632.
