- **4. Title** Transportation of solid waste on state waters
- **5. Summary/Purpose:** The bill would provide that the Director of the Department of Environmental Quality may grant variances for the commercial transport, loading, and offloading of solid waste on waters of the Commonwealth from statutory requirements regarding the transportation of solid waste on state waters provided: (i) travel on state waters is minimized; (ii) the solid waste is easily identifiable, is not hazardous, and is containerized so as to prevent the escape of liquids, waste, and odors; (iii) the containers are secured to the vessel to prevent spillage; (iv) the amount of solid waste transported does not exceed 300 tons annually; and (v) the activity will not occur when weather conditions pose a risk of the vessel losing its load.
- **6. Fiscal impact:** There could be some costs to the Department of Environmental Quality associated with the granting of variances. However, any such costs could be funded from existing resources.
- 7. Budget amendment necessary: No.
- 8. Fiscal implications: See Item 6.
- **9.** Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: Department of Environmental Quality; Town of Tangier; Accomack County.
- 10. Technical amendment necessary: No.
- **11. Other comments:** The potential variances would currently apply to the transportation of solid waste from the Town of Tangier to the landfill in Accomack County.
