- **5. Summary/Purpose:** This bill allows the Birth-Related Neurological Injury Compensation Program's response to a claimant's petition is not due until after the three-physician panel's report is filed with the Workers' Compensation Commission. Upon the filing of the Program's response, the Commission shall set the hearing date.
- **6. Fiscal Impact:** No Impact to the Commonwealth. See Item Eight below.
- 7. Budget amendment necessary: No
- **8. Fiscal implications:** The Birth-Related Neurological Injury Compensation Program (Program) is funded through a trust fund that is established by the <u>Code of Virginia</u>, in Title 38.2. There are two changes outlined in this bill amending current sections of the code. Doctors, hospitals, and insurance companies fund the Program through payments to the trust fund. Neither general fund nor non-general fund dollars are allocated to the program. Therefore, the changes will not have an impact to state funding.

The only substantial changes (lines 101-115) alters the timing of reports issued by the Birth-Related Neurological Injury Compensation Program. Program staff feels this change will not have a fiscal impact on the state and will have a positive impact on service delivery.
