- 4. Title Capitol restoration; sale of surplus property and transfer of proceeds.
- **5. Summary/Purpose:** Provides for the sale of surplus property from the Virginia Capitol restoration and expansion project and the transfer of the proceeds, less actual direct costs from the sale to the Virginia Capitol Preservation Foundation. The bill also provides that the Department of General Services shall conduct a separate sale of the chairs used in the chambers of the houses to the current and former members of the General Assembly.

- 7. Budget amendment necessary: No.
- 8. Fiscal implications: It is unknown at this time what surplus material may become available from the Capitol restoration and expansion project. Therefore, it is not possible to determine a dollar value for this fiscal impact statement. Assuming any surplus identified and sold was originally purchased with general funds, the general fund would not receive its share of the net sale revenue (50 percent) and the Conservation Resources Fund would not receive its 50 percent share. Instead, the Foundation would receive the proceeds.
