6	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 14 of Title 8.01 an article numbered 2.1,
7	consisting of a section numbered 8.01-391.1, relating to the creation of the Check 21 Evidence Act.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 14 of Title 8.01 an article
10	numbered 2.1, consisting of a section numbered 8.01-391.1 as follows:
11	Article 2.1.
12	Check 21 Evidence Act.
13	§ 8.01-391.1. Substitute checks as evidence.
14	A. A substitute check created pursuant to the federal Check 21 Act, 12 U.S.C. § 5001 et seq., shall
15	be admissible in evidence in any legal proceeding, civil or criminal, to the same extent the original
16	check would be.
17	B. A document received from a banking institution that is designated as a "substitute check" and that
18	bears the legend "This is a legal copy of your check. You can use it the same way you would use the
19	original check" shall be presumed to be a substitute check created pursuant to the federal Check 21 Act.
20	C. Any person who shall forge a substitute check or utter or attempt to employ as true any forged
21	substitute check shall be punished as provided in § 18.2-172.

2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or 22 23 24 commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation cannot

be determined for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities and is \$0 for 25 periods of commitment to the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice.

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
