065196380 1 **HOUSE BILL NO. 1150** 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the House Committee on Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources 4 on February 8, 2006) 5 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Lingamfelter) 6 A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 62.1 a chapter numbered 3.7, consisting of 7 sections numbered 62.1-44.117 and 62.1-44.118, relating to the Chesapeake Bay and Virginia Waters 8 Clean-up and Oversight Act. 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 62.1 a chapter numbered 3.7, 10 1. 11 consisting of sections numbered 62.1-44.117 and 62.1-44.118 as follows: CHAPTER 3.7. 12 13 CHESAPEAKE BAY AND VIRGINIA WATERS CLEAN-UP AND OVERSIGHT ACT. 14 § 62.1-44.117. Development of an impaired waters clean-up plan; strategies; objectives. 15 A. The Secretary of Natural Resources shall develop a plan for the cleanup of the Chesapeake Bay and Virginia's waters designated as impaired by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The plan 16 17 shall be revised and amended as needed to reflect changes in strategies, timetables, and milestones. Upon the request of the Secretary of Natural Resources, state agencies shall participate in the 18 19 development of the plan. 20 B. The plan shall address both point and nonpoint sources of pollution and shall include, but not be 21 limited to the following: 22 1. Measurable and attainable objectives for cleaning up the Chesapeake Bay and other impaired 23 Virginia waters: 24 2. A description of the strategies to be implemented to meet specific and attainable objectives 25 outlined in the plan; 26 3. Time frames or phasing to accomplish plan objectives and the expected dates of completion; 27 4. A clearly defined, prioritized, and sufficiently funded program of work within the plan both for 28 point and nonpoint source clean-up projects: 29 5. A disbursement projection plan detailing the expenditures for point and nonpoint projects and 30 whenever possible, a listing of the specific projects to which the funds are to be allocated; 31 6. Potential problem areas where delays in the implementation of the plan may occur; 32 7. A risk mitigation strategy designed to reduce the potential problems that might delay plan 33 *implementation*: 34 8. A description of the extent of coordination between state and local governments in developing and 35 achieving the plan's objectives: 36 9. Assessments of alternative funding mechanisms, that shall include but not be limited to the 37 feasibility of utilizing the Virginia Resources Authority, that would address the needs of the 38 Commonwealth to handle and appropriate state funds prudently and efficiently and address the needs of 39 localities to achieve their goals in a timely and affordable manner; and 40 10. Recommendations to the oversight committees, as defined in § 62.1-44.118, for legislative action. 41 C. In reporting and documenting progress being made in clean-up efforts to the oversight 42 committees, the plan shall include measures to assess the progress in accomplishing the program of work outlined in the plan. Special emphasis shall be given to the identification of trends that are either 43 44 positively or negatively impacting plan accomplishment. These shall include, but are not limited to: 1. Stream miles removed from the 303(d) list under the federal Clean Water Act; waters meeting 45 water quality standards; and total reductions of nitrogen, phosphorus, and sediment by tributary basin 46 47 from point and nonpoint sources of pollution; 2. Number of best management practices (BMP) implemented; participation level in BMP cost-share **48** 49 programs; number of Total Maximum Daily Loads developed and implemented; local compliance levels 50 with nonpoint programs, such as erosion and sediment control, stormwater management, and the 51 Chesapeake Bay Preservation Act; number of wastewater treatment upgrades underway and number 52 completed; and levels of compliance with nutrient-based permit limits; and 53 3. Updated or new strategies that would permit the optimal use of resources to meet plan objectives 54 as the plan is revised over time. 55 For the purposes of this chapter "impaired waters" means those waters as defined in § 62.1-44.19:4. § 62.1-44.118. Status reports on progress; legislative oversight. 56 The Secretary of Natural Resources shall submit the impaired waters clean-up plan as described in 57 § 62.1-44.117 no later than January 1, 2007, to the House Committee on Agriculture, Chesapeake and 58 59 Natural Resources, the House Committee on Appropriations, the Senate Committee on Agriculture,

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60 Conservation and Natural Resources, and the Senate Committee on Finance. Thereafter, a progress

61 report on the implementation of the plan shall be submitted semiannually to these committees of 62 oversight. If there are questions as to the status of the clean-up effort the chairman of any of these

63 committees may convene his committee for the purpose of receiving testimony. The executive branch

64 departments and the Secretary of Natural Resources may request a meeting of any of the committees to

65 inform them as to the progress of the cleanup or to propose specific initiatives that may require 66 legislative action.

67 2. That the Virginia Resources Authority shall provide to the Secretary of Natural Resources

68 alternative funding mechanisms to carry out the provisions of this act.
