That § 18.2-371.3 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 18.2-371.3. Tattooing or body piercing; minors; penalty. 11 No person shall tattoo or perform body piercing on a person less than eighteen [18 16] years of 12 13 age. No person shall [tattoo or] perform body piercing on a person less than 18 years of age knowing or having reason to believe such person is less than eighteen 18 years of age except (i) in the 14 15 presence of the person's parent or guardian, or (ii) when done by or under the supervision of a medical 16 doctor, registered nurse or other medical services personnel licensed pursuant to Title 54.1 in the performance of their duties. 17 In addition, no person shall tattoo or perform body piercing on any client unless he complies with 18 19 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's guidelines for "Universal Blood and Body Fluid 20 Precautions" and provides the client with the following disclosure: 21 1. Tattooing and body piercing are invasive procedures in which the skin is penetrated by a foreign 22 object. 23 2. If proper sterilization and antiseptic procedures are not followed by tattoo artists and body 24 piercers, there is a risk of transmission of bloodborne pathogens and other infections, including, but not 25 limited to, human immunodeficiency viruses and hepatitis B or C viruses. 26 3. Tattooing and body piercing may cause allergic reactions in persons sensitive to dyes or the metals 27 used in ornamentation. 28 4. Tattooing and body piercing may involve discomfort or pain for which appropriate anesthesia 29 cannot be legally made available by the person performing the tattoo or body piercing unless such 30 person holds the appropriate license from a Virginia health regulatory board. 31 A person who violates this section is guilty of a Class 2 I misdemeanor. [Any second or subsequent violation of this section shall be punished as a Class 1 misdemeanor 6 felony. 32 33 For the purposes of this section: "Body-piercing" means the act of penetrating the skin to make a hole, mark, or scar, generally permanent in nature. "Body piercing" does not include the use of a mechanized, presterilized 34 35 36 ear-piercing system that penetrates the outer perimeter or lobe of the ear or both. 37 "Tattoo" means to place any design, letter, scroll, figure, symbol or any other mark upon or under the skin of any person with ink or any other substance resulting in the permanent coloration of the skin, 38 39 including permanent make-up or permanent jewelry, by the aid of needles or any other instrument 40 designed to touch or puncture the skin. 41 2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation cannot 42 be determined for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities and is \$0 for 43 periods of commitment to the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice.] 44
