3	(Proposed by the Joint Conference Committee

5	(Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Jones, D. C.)
6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 18.2-371.3 of the Code of Virginia, relating to tattooing or body
7	piercing of minors; penalty.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 18.2-371.3 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 18.2-371.3. Tattooing or body piercing of minors.
11	No person shall tattoo or perform body piercing for hire or consideration on a person less than
12	eighteen years of age, knowing or having reason to believe such person is less than eighteen years of
13	age except (i) in the presence of the person's parent or guardian, or (ii) when done by or under the
14	supervision of a medical doctor, registered nurse or other medical services personnel licensed pursuant to
15	Title 54.1 in the performance of their duties.
16	In addition, no person shall tattoo or perform body piercing on any client unless he complies with
17	the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's guidelines for "Universal Blood and Body Fluid
18 19	Precautions" and provides the client with the following disclosure:
19 20	1. Tattooing and body piercing are invasive procedures in which the skin is penetrated by a foreign object.
20 21	2. If proper sterilization and antiseptic procedures are not followed by tattoo artists and body
22	piercers, there is a risk of transmission of bloodborne pathogens and other infections, including, but not
23	limited to, human immunodeficiency viruses and hepatitis B or C viruses.
23 24	3. Tattooing and body piercing may cause allergic reactions in persons sensitive to dyes or the metals
25	used in ornamentation.
26	4. Tattooing and body piercing may involve discomfort or pain for which appropriate anesthesia
27	cannot be legally made available by the person performing the tattoo or body piercing unless such
28	person holds the appropriate license from a Virginia health regulatory board.
29	A person who violates this section is guilty of a Class 2 1 misdemeanor. Any second or subsequent
30	violation of this section shall be punished as a Class 1 misdemeanor.
31	For the purposes of this section:
32	"Body-piercing" means the act of penetrating the skin to make a hole, mark, or scar, generally
33	permanent in nature. "Body piercing" does not include the use of a mechanized, presterilized
34	ear-piercing system that penetrates the outer perimeter or lobe of the ear or both.
35	"Tattoo" means to place any design, letter, scroll, figure, symbol or any other mark upon or under
36	the skin of any person with ink or any other substance resulting in the permanent coloration of the skin,
37	including permanent make-up or permanent jewelry, by the aid of needles or any other instrument
38	designed to touch or puncture the skin.
