5 6	A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 9.1-902 and 18.2-472.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to sex
7	offender registration; penalty.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That §§ 9.1-902 and 18.2-472.1 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 9.1-902. Offenses requiring registration.
11	A. For purposes of this chapter:
12 13	"Offense for which registration is required" means: 1. A violation or attempted violation of § 18.2-63, 18.2-64.1, former § 18.2-67.2:1, § 18.2-90 with the
13	intent to commit rape, § 18.2-374.1 or subsection D of § 18.2-374.1:1; or a third or subsequent
15	conviction of (i) $\$$ 18.2-67.4, (ii) subsection C of $\$$ 18.2-67.5 or (iii) $\$$ 18.2-386.1;
16	If the offense was committed on or after July 1, 2006, (i) a violation or attempted violation of
17	§ 18.2-91 with the intent to commit any felony offense listed in this section or (ii) a violation or
18	attempted violation of subsection A of § 18.2-374.1:1.
19 20	2. Where Clause (iv) of subsection B of § 18.2-374.3 or where the victim is a minor or is physically helpless or mentally incapacitated as defined in § 18.2-67.10, a violation or attempted violation of

23	3. A violation of Chapter 117 (18 U.S.C. § 2421 et seq.) of Title 18 of the United States Code;
24	4. A "sexually violent offense"; or

20 27	6. Criminal homicide in conjunction with a violation of clause (i) of § 18.2-371 or § 18.2-371.1, when the offenses arise out of the same incident.
28	"Murder" means a violation of § 18.2-31 or 18.2-32 where the victim is a minor (i) under 15 years
29	of age or (ii) where the victim is at least 15 years of age but under 18 years of age and the murder is
30	related to an offense listed in this section.
31 32	"Sexually violent offense" means a violation or attempted violation of: 1. Clause (ii) of § 18.2-48, § 18.2-61, 18.2-67.1, 18.2-67.2, 18.2-67.3, § 18.2-67.4 where the
33	perpetrator is 18 years of age or older and the victim is under the age of six, subsections A and B of
34	§ 18.2-67.5, § 18.2-370, or 18.2-370.1; or
35	2. Sections 18.2-63, 18.2-64.1, former § 18.2-67.2:1, § 18.2-90 with the intent to commit rape or,
36	where the victim is a minor or is physically helpless or mentally incapacitated as defined in
37 38	§ 18.2-67.10, a violation or attempted violation of subsection A of § 18.2-47, § 18.2-67.4, subsection C of § 18.2-67.5, clause (i) or (iii) of § 18.2-48, § 18.2-361, 18.2-366, or 18.2-374.1. An offense listed
39	under this subdivision shall be deemed a sexually violent offense only if the person has been convicted
40	or adjudicated delinquent of any two or more such offenses, provided that person had been at liberty
41	between such convictions or adjudications.
42	3. If the offense was committed on or after July 1, 2006, a violation or attempted violation of
43	§ 18.2-91 with the intent to commit any felony offense listed in this section. An offense listed under this
44 45	subdivision shall be deemed a sexually violent offense only if the person has been convicted or adjudicated delinquent of any two or more such offenses, provided that person had been at liberty
46	between such convictions or adjudications.
47	B. "Offense for which registration is required" and "sexually violent offense" shall also include any
48	similar offense under the laws of (i) any foreign country or any political subdivision thereof, (ii) the
49 50	United States or any political subdivision thereof and any offense for which registration in a sex
50 51	offender and crimes against minors registry is required under the laws of the political subdivision <i>jurisdiction</i> where the offender was convicted.
51 52	C. Juveniles adjudicated delinquent shall not be required to register; however, where the offender is a
53	juvenile over the age of 13 at the time of the offense who is tried as a juvenile and is adjudicated
54	delinquent of any offense enumerated in subdivisions A 1 through A 4 on or after July 1, 2005, the
55	court may, in its discretion and upon motion of the attorney for the Commonwealth, find that the
56 57	circumstances of the offense require offender registration. In making its determination, the court shall
57 58	consider all of the following factors that are relevant to the case: (i) the degree to which the delinquent act was committed with the use of force, threat or intimidation, (ii) the age and maturity of the
59	complaining witness, (iii) the age and maturity of the offender, (iv) the difference in the ages of the

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60 complaining witness and the offender, (v) the nature of the relationship between the complaining witness

and the offender, (vi) the offender's prior criminal history, and (vii) any other aggravating or mitigatingfactors relevant to the case.

63 § 18.2-472.1. Providing false information or failing to provide registration information; penalty; prima facie evidence.

A. Any person subject to Chapter 9 (§ 9.1-900 et seq.) of Title 9.1, other than a person convicted of
a sexually violent offense or murder as defined in § 9.1-902, who knowingly fails to register or
reregister, or who knowingly provides materially false information to the Sex Offender and Crimes
Against Minors Registry is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. A second or subsequent conviction for an
offense under this subsection is a Class 6 felony.

However, any B. Any person convicted of a sexually violent offense or murder, as defined in
§ 9.1-902, who knowingly fails to register or reregister, or who knowingly provides materially false
information to the Sex Offender and Crimes Against Minors Registry is guilty of a Class 6 felony. A
second or subsequent conviction for an offense under this subsection is a Class 5 felony.

74 C. A prosecution pursuant to this section shall be brought in the city or county where the offender 75 can be found or where the offender last registered or reregistered or, if the offender failed to comply 76 with the duty to register, where the offender was last convicted of an offense for which registration or 77 reregistration is required.

D. At any trial pursuant to this section, an affidavit from the State Police issued as required in § 9.1-907 shall be admitted into evidence as prima facie evidence of the failure to comply with the duty to register or reregister and a copy of such affidavit shall be provided to the registrant or his counsel seven days prior to hearing or trial by the attorney for the Commonwealth.

E. For the purposes of this section any conviction for a substantially similar offense under the laws
of (i) any foreign country or political subdivision thereof, or (ii) any state or territory of the United
States or any political subdivision thereof, the District of Columbia, or the United States shall be
considered a prior conviction.

86 2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or
87 commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation is
88 \$616, 909 for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities and is \$0 for periods of
89 commitment to the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice.
