AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

(Proposed by the House Committee on Counties, Cities and Towns

on January 27, 2006)

(Patrons Prior to Substitute—Delegates Bell and Landes [HB 1189])

A BILL to amend and reenact § 15.2-1736 of the Code of Virginia, relating to mutual aid agreements.

234567 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

- 8 1. That § 15.2-1736 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 9
  - § 15.2-1736. Mutual aid agreements among governing bodies of localities.

10 The governing bodies of localities, and state-supported institutions of higher learning having a police force appointed pursuant to § 23-233, as well as sheriffs with law-enforcement authority within localities 11 without a police force, and the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation with 12 commissioned conservation officers, or any combination thereof may, by proper resolutions, enter in and 13 become a party to contracts or mutual aid agreements for the use of their joint police or other 14 law-enforcement forces, both regular and auxiliary, their equipment and materials to maintain peace and 15 good order. However, no such state-supported institution of higher learning shall enter into such 16 agreement with another state-supported institution of higher education in a noncontiguous locality 17 without the consent of all localities within which such institutions are located. Any police or other 18 law-enforcement officer, regular or auxiliary, while performing his duty under any such contract or 19 20 agreement, shall have the same authority in such locality as he has within the locality where he was 21 appointed.

22 In counties where no police department has been established, the sheriff may, in his discretion, enter

23 into mutual aid agreements as provided by this section.
