That § 23-4.3:1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 23-4.3:1. Policies addressing textbook sales and bookstores. 11 A. No employee at a Virginia public college or university shall demand or receive any payment, 12 loan, subscription, advance, deposit of money, services or anything, present or promised, as an 13 inducement for requiring students to purchase a specific textbook required for coursework or instruction; 14 15 with the exception that the employee may receive (i) sample copies, instructor's copies, or instructional 16 material, not to be sold; and (ii) royalties or other compensation from sales of textbooks that include such instructor's own writing or work. 17 B. The governing boards shall implement procedures for making available to students in a central 18 19 location and in a standard format on the relevant institutional website listings of textbooks required or 20 assigned for particular courses at the institution. 21 The lists of those required or assigned textbooks for each particular course shall include the 22 International Standard Book Number (ISBN) along with other relevant information. 23 Institutions maintaining a bookstore supported by auxiliary services or operated by a private 24 contractor shall post the listing of such textbooks when the relevant instructor or academic department 25 identifies the required textbooks for order and subsequent student purchase. C. The governing boards of public institutions of higher education shall implement policies, 26 27 procedures, and guidelines for minimizing the cost of textbooks for students at public colleges and 28 universities while maintaining the quality of education and academic freedom. The guidelines shall 29 require the following: 30 1. That faculty members submit lists of their required textbooks to the university bookstore in a 31 timely manner to ensure that a sufficient quantity of such textbooks are available for purchase by 32 students when courses begin. 33 2. That any on-campus university bookstore selling textbooks to enrolled students as part of a package with other study products recommended by the publisher also sell such textbooks separate of 34 35 such study products [when such study products are available]. 36 3. That faculty members affirmatively acknowledge the price of textbooks they require before the 37 order is complete. 38 4. That faculty be encouraged to limit their use of new edition textbooks when previous editions do 39 not differ substantially. 40 5. That sample copies of textbooks are available for student use through the academic department or university library at no charge to students. 41 6. That the revenue collected by the university from textbook sales at institution-owned or privately 42 contracted bookstores be used solely for (i) on-campus student activities, (ii) financial aid, or (iii) 43 44 improvements to existing university bookstore infrastructure and services. D. No funds provided for financial aid from university bookstore revenue shall be counted in the 45 46 calculation for state appropriations for student financial aid.
