AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

- 234567 A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 18.2-308.1:01, relating to firearms in locked vehicles; immunity from liability; civil penalty. 8
  - Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
- 9 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 18.2-308.1:01 as follows: 10 § 18.2-308.1:01. Firearms in locked vehicles: immunity from liability.

A. No person, property owner, tenant, employer, or business entity shall maintain, establish, or 11 enforce any policy or rule that has the effect of prohibiting a person who may lawfully possess a firearm from storing a firearm locked in or locked to a firearms rack in a motor vehicle in a parking 12 13 14 lot, parking space, or other similar property set aside for motor vehicles.

15 B. No person, property owner, tenant, employer, or business entity shall be liable in any civil action 16 for any occurrence that results from or is connected to the use of a firearm that was lawfully stored 17 pursuant to subsection A, unless the person, property owner, tenant, employer, or business entity 18 commits a criminal act involving the use of the firearm.

C. Any person may enforce this section by filing a petition for injunction in the court of record of 19 20 the county or city in which the person, property owner, tenant, employer, or business entity prohibiting 21 the firearm is located. The court shall award actual damages, court costs, and attorney fees to a 22 prevailing plaintiff.

23 D. This section shall not apply to (i) § 18.2-308.1, relating to possession of firearms on school 24 property and at school activities; (ii) vehicles on privately owned property to which access is restricted 25 or limited through the use of a gate, security station, or other means of restricting or limiting general public access onto the property; or (iii) vehicles owned or leased by an employer or business entity and 26

27 used by an employee in the course of his employment.
