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## **HOUSE BILL NO. 164**

A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-207.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to family life education.

## Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

## 1. That § 22.1-207.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10

§ 22.1-207.1. Family life education.

A. The Board of Education shall develop by December 1, 1987, standards of learning and curriculum 12 13 guidelines for a comprehensive, sequential family life education curriculum in grades K through 12. 14 Such curriculum guidelines shall include instruction as appropriate for the age of the student in family 15 living and community relationships<sub> $\tau$ </sub>; abstinence education<sub> $\tau$ </sub>; the value of postponing sexual activity<sub> $\tau$ </sub>; the 16 benefits of adoption as a positive choice in the event of an unwanted pregnancy; human sexuality; human reproduction; information on the prevention, transmission, and spread of sexually transmitted 17 diseases including acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS); steps to take to avoid sexual assault, 18 and the availability of counseling and legal resources, and, in the event of such sexual assault, the 19 20 importance of immediate medical attention and advice, as well as the requirements of the law and the 21 etiology, prevention and effects of sexually transmitted diseases.

22 B. All such instruction shall be designed to promote parental involvement, foster positive self 23 concepts and provide mechanisms for coping with peer pressure and the stresses of modern living 24 according to the students' developmental stages and abilities. The Board shall also establish requirements 25 for appropriate training for teachers of family life education, which shall include training in instructional 26 elements to support the various curriculum components.

27 C. Any family life education course including a discussion of sexual intercourse shall emphasize that 28 abstinence is the accepted norm and is the only guarantee against unwanted pregnancy and sexually 29 transmitted diseases. Course materials and instruction in any such family life education course shall 30 include the following: 31

1. Age appropriate subject matter:

2. An emphasis on honor and respect for monogamous heterosexual marriage;

33 3. A discussion on the value of postponing sexual activity until marriage including the emotional and 34 psychological consequences of adolescent sexual intercourse and unwanted pregnancy;

35 4. Information on the possible transmission of sexually transmitted diseases through protected and 36 unprotected sexual intercourse;

37 5. An overview of laws addressing (i) the financial responsibility of parents to children born out of 38 wedlock and (ii) circumstances under which it is unlawful for unmarried persons to have sexual 39 relations; and

6. Advice on avoiding unwanted sexual advances and resisting negative peer pressure.

41 D. For the purposes of this section, "abstinence education" means an educational or motivational 42 component which has as its exclusive purpose teaching the social, psychological, and health gains to be realized by teenagers' abstaining from sexual activity before marriage. 43

E. No student shall be required to participate in any class taught pursuant to this section if a parent 44 45 or guardian submits written objection thereto.

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
