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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 25 of Title 2.2 an article numbered
13	8, consisting of sections numbered 2.2-2525 and 2.2-2526, as follows:
14	Article 8.
15	Virginia Commission On Immigration.
16	§ 2.2-2525. Virginia Commission on Immigration; purpose; membership, terms, compensation; staff.
17	A. The Virginia Commission on Immigration (Commission) is established as an advisory commission
18	within the meaning of § 2.2-2100, in the executive branch of state government. The purpose of the
19	Commission is to study, report, and make recommendations for dealing with the impact of immigration
20	and related policies on the Commonwealth. The Commission may make recommendations and
21	coordinate the proposals of all commissions and agencies as to legislation and policies affecting
22	immigration of persons into the Commonwealth.
23	B. The Commission shall consist of 20 members as follows: six members of the House of Delegates
24	to be appointed by the Speaker of the House in accordance with the rules of proportional representation
25	in the Rules of the House; three members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on
26	Rules; and 11 members to be appointed by the Governor as follows: (i) a naturalized citizen who is a
27 28	resident of the Commonwealth, (ii) a resident of the Commonwealth who holds a permanent resident
20 29	visa issued by the U.S. Department of State, and (iii) retirees of either the (a) Immigration and Naturalization Service, (b) Drug Enforcement Agency, (c) Federal Bureau of Investigation, (d) Virginia
29 30	State Police, (e) Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles, (f) Department of Social Services, (g)
30 31	Department of Education, (h) health care providers, or (i) a representative of business interests.
32	C. Members of the Commission shall serve for five-year terms. Whenever any legislative member
33	fails to retain his membership in the house from which he was appointed, his membership shall be
34	vacated, and the vacancy shall be filled in the original manner. Subsequent appointments shall be made
35	for similar terms, and vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired terms by the persons authorized to
36	make the original appointments.
37	D. The members of the Commission shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its
38	members. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum.
39	E. Legislative members of the Commission shall receive compensation as provided in § 30-19.12, and
40	all members shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of
41	their duties as provided in § 2.2-2825. All reimbursable expenses shall be paid from existing
42	appropriations to the Commission.
43	F. The Commission may appoint, employ, and remove an executive director and one administrative
44 45	assistant and determine their duties and fix their salaries or compensation within the amounts
45 46	appropriated therefor. The Commission may also obtain such assistance as it may deem necessary from
46 47	other legislative and executive agencies and may employ experts who have special knowledge of the issues before it.
<b>4</b> 8	§ 2.2-2526. Powers and duties of the Commission.
49	A. The Commission shall have the power and duty to gather and analyze information and data to
50	accomplish its purpose as set forth in § 2.2-2525.
50 51	B. The Chairman of the Commission shall have the authority to invite other interested parties to sit
52	with the Commission and to participate in its deliberations without compensation by the Commission.
53	C. The Commission shall examine the operations, management, jurisdiction, powers and
54	interrelationships of any department, board, bureau, commission, authority, or other agency with any
55	direct responsibility for setting policy and managing services for immigrants entering the
56	Commonwealth.
57	D. The Commission may maintain offices and may hold meetings and functions at any place within
58	the Commonwealth as it may deem necessary.

59 E. The Commission shall make an annual report to the Governor and the General Assembly that

60 shall include its recommendations. The Commission shall make such further interim reports to the 61 Governor and the General Assembly as it shall deem advisable or as shall be required by the Governor

62 or General Assembly.
