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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 22.1-253.13:4 of the Code of Virginia, relating to calculation of high 3 school graduation rates.

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Approved

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6

7 1. That § 22.1-253.13:4 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

8 § 22.1-253.13:4. Standard 4. Student achievement and graduation requirements.

9 A. Each local school board shall award diplomas to all secondary school students, including students 10 who transfer from nonpublic schools or from home instruction, who earn the units of credit prescribed by the Board of Education, pass the prescribed tests, and meet such other requirements as may be 11 12 prescribed by the local school board and approved by the Board of Education. Provisions shall be made 13 for students who transfer between secondary schools and from nonpublic schools or from home instruction as outlined in the standards for accreditation. Further, reasonable accommodation to meet the 14 15 requirements for diplomas shall be provided for otherwise qualified students with disabilities as needed.

In addition, each local school board may devise, vis-à-vis the award of diplomas to secondary school 16 17 students, a mechanism for calculating class rankings that takes into consideration whether the student has 18 taken a required class more than one time and has had any prior earned grade for such required class 19 expunged.

20 Each local school board shall notify the parent of rising eleventh and twelfth grade students of (i) the 21 number of standard and verified units of credit required for graduation pursuant to the standards of accreditation and (ii) the remaining number of such units of credit the individual student requires for 22 23 graduation.

24 B. Students identified as disabled who complete the requirements of their individualized education 25 programs shall be awarded special diplomas by local school boards.

26 Each local school board shall notify the parent of such students with disabilities who have an 27 individualized education program and who fail to meet the requirements for graduation of the student's 28 right to a free and appropriate education to age 21, inclusive, pursuant to Article 2 (§ 22.1-213 et seq.) 29 of Chapter 13 of this title.

30 C. Students who have completed a prescribed course of study as defined by the local school board 31 shall be awarded certificates of program completion by local school boards if they are not eligible to 32 receive a standard, advanced studies, modified standard, or general achievement diploma.

33 Each local school board shall provide notification of the right to a free public education for students 34 who have not reached 20 years of age on or before August 1 of the school year, pursuant to Chapter 1 35 (§ 22.1-1 et seq.) of this title, to the parent of students who fail to graduate or who have failed to achieve the number of verified units of credit required for graduation as provided in the standards of 36 37 accreditation. If such student who does not graduate or achieve such verified units of credit is a student for whom English is a second language, the local school board shall notify the parent of the student's 38 39 opportunity for a free public education in accordance with § 22.1-5. 40

D. In establishing course and credit requirements for a high school diploma, the Board shall:

41 1. Provide for the selection of integrated learning courses meeting the Standards of Learning and 42 approved by the Board to satisfy graduation credit requirements, which shall include Standards of 43 Learning testing, as necessary;

2. Establish the requirements for a standard, modified standard, or advanced studies high school 44 45 diploma, which shall include one credit in fine, performing, or practical arts and one credit in United States and Virginia history. The requirements for a standard high school diploma shall, however, include 46 47 at least two sequential electives chosen from a concentration of courses selected from a variety of 48 options that may be planned to ensure the completion of a focused sequence of elective courses. 49 Students may take such focused sequence of elective courses in consecutive years or any two years of high school. Such focused sequence of elective courses shall provide a foundation for further education 50 or training or preparation for employment and shall be developed by the school division, consistent with 51 52 Board of Education guidelines and as approved by the local school board;

53 3. Provide, in the requirements for the verified units of credit stipulated for obtaining the standard or 54 advanced studies diploma, that students completing elective classes into which the Standards of Learning 55 for any required course have been integrated may take the relevant Standards of Learning test for the 56 relevant required course and receive, upon achieving a satisfactory score on the specific Standards of

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57 Learning assessment, a verified unit of credit for such elective class that shall be deemed to satisfy the58 Board's requirement for verified credit for the required course;

4. Establish a procedure to facilitate the acceleration of students that allows qualified students, with
the recommendation of the division superintendent, without completing the 140-hour class, to obtain
credit for such class upon demonstration of mastery of the course content and objectives. Having
received credit for the course, the student shall be permitted to sit for the relevant Standards of Learning
assessment and, upon receiving a passing score, shall earn a verified credit. Nothing in this section shall
preclude relevant school division personnel from enforcing compulsory attendance in public schools; and

65 5. Provide for the award of verified units of credit for passing scores on industry certifications, state
66 licensure examinations, and national occupational competency assessments approved by the Board of
67 Education.

68 School boards shall report annually to the Board of Education the number of industry certifications69 obtained and state licensure examinations passed, and the number shall be reported as a category on the70 School Performance Report Card.

In addition, the Board may:

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a. For the purpose of awarding verified units of credit, approve the use of additional or substitute
 tests for the correlated Standards of Learning assessment, such as academic achievement tests, industry
 certifications or state licensure examinations; and

75 b. Permit students completing career and technical education programs designed to enable such 76 students to pass such industry certification examinations or state licensure examinations to be awarded, 77 upon obtaining satisfactory scores on such industry certification or licensure examinations, the 78 appropriate verified units of credit for one or more career and technical education classes into which 79 relevant Standards of Learning for various classes taught at the same level have been integrated. Such 80 industry certification and state licensure examinations may cover relevant Standards of Learning for various required classes and may, at the discretion of the Board, address some Standards of Learning for 81 82 several required classes.

E. In the exercise of its authority to recognize exemplary academic performance by providing for
diploma seals, the Board of Education shall develop criteria for recognizing exemplary performance in
career and technical education programs by students who have completed the requirements for a
standard or advanced studies diploma and shall award seals on the diplomas of students meeting such
criteria.

In addition, the Board shall establish criteria for awarding a diploma seal for advanced mathematics
 and technology for the standard and advanced studies diplomas. The Board shall consider including
 criteria for (i) technology courses; (ii) technical writing, reading, and oral communication skills; (iii)
 technology-related practical arts training; and (iv) industry, professional, and trade association national
 certifications.

93 The Board shall also establish criteria for awarding a diploma seal for excellence in civics education 94 and understanding of our state and federal constitutions and the democratic model of government for the 95 standard and advanced studies diplomas. The Board shall consider including criteria for (i) successful 96 completion of history, government, and civics courses, including courses that incorporate character 97 education; (ii) voluntary participation in community service or extracurricular activities; and (iii) related 98 requirements as it deems appropriate.

99 F. The Board shall establish, by regulation, requirements for the award of a general achievement 100 diploma for those persons who have (i) achieved a passing score on the GED examination; (ii) 101 successfully completed an education and training program designated by the Board of Education; and 102 (iii) satisfied other requirements as may be established by the Board for the award of such diploma.

103 G. To ensure the uniform assessment of high school graduation rates, the Board shall collect, 104 analyze, and report high school graduation and dropout data using a formula prescribed by the Board.

105 The Board may promulgate such regulations as may be necessary and appropriate for the collection, 106 analysis, and reporting of such data.

107 2. That the Board of Education shall report to the House Committee on Education and the Senate 108 Committee on Education and Health by December 1, 2006, on the formula to be used for the 109 uniform assessment of high school graduation rates. In developing the formula, the Board of 110 Education shall consider the 2005 Report of the National Governors Association Task Force on 111 State High School Graduation Data.

112 3. That the provisions of the first enactment clause of this act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
