10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Article 1 of Chapter 1 of Title 24.2 a
12	section numbered 24.2-101.1 as follows:
13	§ 24.2-101.1. Materials and ballots in non-English translations.
14	A. The electoral board of any county, city, or town may provide elections materials and ballots in
15	non-English translations.
16 17	B. On and after July 1, 2007, a covered county, city, or town shall provide elections materials and ballots in non-English translations. By January 1, 2007, the State Board of Elections shall provide a list
18	of covered counties, cities, and towns based on available United States Census data and other available
19	information and on the following criteria: (i) more than 3% of the citizens of voting age of the county,
20	city, or town, are members of a single language minority and are limited English proficient; or (ii) more
21	than 5,000 citizens of voting age of a county, city, or town are members of a single language minority
22	and are limited English proficient; and (iii) the illiteracy rate of the citizens in the language minority as
23	a group is higher that the national illiteracy rate.
24	C. Whenever any covered county, city, or town provides any registration or voting notices, forms,
25	instructions, assistance, or other materials or information relating to the electoral process, including
26	ballots, it shall provide them in the language of the applicable minority group as well as in the English
27	language.
28 29	D. As used in this section: "Voting materials" means registration or voting notices, forms, instructions, assistance, or other
30	materials or information relating to the electoral process, including ballots.
31	"Limited-English proficient" means unable to speak or understand English adequately enough to
32	participate in the electoral process.
33	"Citizens" means citizens of the United States.
34	"Illiteracy" means the failure to complete the 5th primary grade.
