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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 54.1-3005 of the Code of Virginia, relating to nursing education 3 programs.

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That § 54.1-3005 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 54.1-3005. Specific powers and duties of Board.

9 In addition to the general powers and duties conferred in this title, the Board shall have the 10 following specific powers and duties:

1. To prescribe minimum standards and approve curricula for educational programs preparing persons 11 12 for licensure or certification under this chapter;

- 13 2. To approve programs that meet the requirements of this chapter and of the Board; 14
 - 3. To provide consultation service for educational programs as requested;
- 15 4. To provide for periodic surveys of educational programs;
- 5. To deny or withdraw approval from educational programs for failure to meet prescribed standards; 16
- 17 6. To provide consultation regarding nursing practice for institutions and agencies as requested and investigate illegal nursing practices; 18 19
 - 7. To keep a record of all its proceedings;

20 8. To certify and maintain a registry of all certified nurse aides and to promulgate regulations consistent with federal law and regulation. The Board shall require all schools to demonstrate their 21 compliance with § 54.1-3006.2 upon application for approval or reapproval, during an on-site visit, or in 22 response to a complaint or a report of noncompliance. The Board may impose a fee pursuant to § 54.1-2401 for any violation thereof. Such regulations may include standards for the authority of 23 24 25 licensed practical nurses to teach nurse aides;

9. To approve programs that entitle professional nurses to be registered as clinical nurse specialists 26 27 and to prescribe minimum standards for such programs;

28 10. To maintain a registry of clinical nurse specialists and to promulgate regulations governing 29 clinical nurse specialists;

30 11. To certify and maintain a registry of all certified massage therapists and to promulgate 31 regulations governing the criteria for certification as a massage therapist and the standards of 32 professional conduct for certified massage therapists;

33 12. To promulgate regulations for the delegation of certain nursing tasks and procedures not 34 involving assessment, evaluation or nursing judgment to an appropriately trained unlicensed person by 35 and under the supervision of a registered nurse, who retains responsibility and accountability for such 36 delegation;

37 13. To develop and revise as may be necessary, in coordination with the Boards of Medicine and 38 Education, guidelines for the training of employees of a school board in the administration of insulin 39 and glucagon for the purpose of assisting with routine insulin injections and providing emergency 40 treatment for life-threatening hypoglycemia. The first set of such guidelines shall be finalized by 41 September 1, 1999, and shall be made available to local school boards for a fee not to exceed the costs 42 of publication;

- 43 14. To enter into the Nurse Licensure Compact as set forth in this chapter and to promulgate 44 regulations for its implementation;
- 45 15. To collect, store and make available nursing workforce information regarding the various 46 categories of nurses certified, licensed or registered pursuant to § 54.1-3012.1;

16. To expedite application processing, to the extent possible, for an applicant for licensure or 47 48 certification by the Board upon submission of evidence that the applicant, who is licensed or certified in 49 another state, is relocating to the Commonwealth pursuant to a spouse's official military orders;

50 17. To register medication aides and promulgate regulations governing the criteria for such 51 registration and standards of conduct for medication aides; and

18. To approve training programs for medication aides to include requirements for instructional 52 53 personnel, curriculum, continuing education, and a competency evaluation-; and

54 19. To set guidelines for the collection of data by all approved nursing education programs and to 55 compile this data in an annual report. The data shall include but not be limited to enrollment, 56 graduation rate, attrition rate, and number of qualified applicants who are denied admission.

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
