10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That § 54.1-409 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 54.1-409. Landscape architecture.
13	Resulting plans and specifications, submitted under the seal, stamp or certification of a certified
14	landscape architect, mayshall be accepted by local and state authorities, in connection with both public
15	and private projects. However, no landscape architect, unless he is also licensed as a land surveyor, shall
16	provide boundary surveys, plats or descriptions for any purpose, except in conjunction with or under the
17	supervision of an appropriately licensed professional, who shall provide certification, as required.
18	Nothing contained herein or in the definition of "practice of landscape architecture" in § 54.1-400
19 20	shall be construed to restrict or otherwise affect the right of any nurseryman, landscape designer, land planner, community planner, landscape gardener, golf course designer, turf maintenance specialist or any
21	other similar person from engaging in such occupation, or from rendering any service in connection
22	therewith that is not otherwise proscribed. No person shall hold himself out as, or use the title of,
23	"landscape architect" or "certified landscape architect," unless he has been certified pursuant to the
24	provisions of this chapter.
25	Any person who (i) used and was identified by the title "landscape architect" for ten years prior to
26	July 1, 2000, (ii) holds an accredited undergraduate or graduate degree in landscape architecture, and
27 28	(iii) can demonstrate to the Board satisfactory evidence of ten years of professional practice experience
40	representing the full range of landscape architectural knowledge, skills, and abilities represented on the

29 examination used by the Board to certify landscape architects, shall be entitled to apply to and secure
30 from the Board, without written examination, a certificate pursuant to the provisions of this chapter,
31 provided all other requirements of this chapter relating to landscape architecture are complied with and
32 application is or has been made on or before July 1, 2001.
