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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 26 of Title 45.1 sections numbered 3 45.1-393 and 45.1-394, relating to the establishment of the Biofuels Production Incentive Grant 4 Program and Fund.

7 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 26 of Title 45.1 sections numbered 9 45.1-393 and 45.1-394 as follows:

10 § 45.1-393. Biofuels Production Fund established.

11 There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Biofuels Production Fund, hereafter referred to as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established on the books of the 12 13 Comptroller. The Fund shall consist of such moneys as may be appropriated to it by the General Assembly. Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for the purposes of providing grants to certain 14 15 producers of biofuels as specified in § 45.1-394. Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the 16 17 Director of the Division of Energy.

18 § 45.1-394. Biofuels Production Incentive Grant Program.

19 A. For the purposes of this section:

20 "Biodiesel fuels" means a renewable, biodegradable, mono-alkyl ester combustible liquid fluid fuel 21 from agricultural plant oils or animal fats that meets American Society for Testing and Materials 22 (ASTM) specifications for Biodiesel Fuel (B100) Blend Stock for Distillate Fuels.

23 "Biofuels" means neat biodiesel fuel or neat ethanol fuel that is not blended with a traditional fuel 24 such as gasoline or diesel.

"Ethanol fuels" means fermentation alcohol derived from agricultural products, including potatoes, 25 26 cereal grains, dry mill corn, whey, and sugar beets; forest products; or other renewable resources, 27 including residue and waste generated from the production, processing, and marketing of agricultural 28 products, forest products, and other renewable resources, that: 29

1. Meets all applicable ASTM specifications; and 30

2. Is denatured as specified in 27 C.F.R. Parts 20 and 21.

31 "Feedstock" means the agricultural or other renewable resources, whether plant or animal derived, 32 used to produce biofuels.

33 "Producer" means any person or entity that, in a calendar year, produces in the Commonwealth at 34 least 10 million gallons of biofuels using feedstock originating domestically within the United States.

35 B. A producer of neat biofuels commencing qualifying sales on or after January 1, 2007, shall be 36 eligible to receive a biofuels production incentive grant in an amount equal to \$0.10 for each gallon of 37 neat biofuels sold by it in the calendar year beginning with calendar year 2007. To be eligible for an 38 incentive grant for neat biofuels sales in any given calendar year, the producer shall have produced in 39 the Commonwealth at least 10 million gallons of neat biofuels in such year. In addition, any producer 40 producing neat biofuels prior to January 1, 2007, shall be eligible for an incentive grant for neat 41 biofuel sales in the respective calendar year only if its production in the Commonwealth of neat biofuels 42 for such calendar year exceeds its production in the Commonwealth of neat biofuels in the 2006 43 calendar year by at least 10 million gallons, and if it maintains production at a minimum of that level 44 in future years. A producer shall be eligible for a grant from the Biofuels Production Fund (the Fund) 45 established under § 45.1-393 only for each gallon of neat biofuels that it produces in the Commonwealth on or after January 1, 2007, which gallon has also been sold by the producer to customers. Grants 46 47 awarded under this section shall be paid from the Fund.

C. In the event applications for grants pursuant to subsection B exceed the total amount of money 48 allocated in the Fund, grant payments shall be apportioned among eligible producers pro rata based 49 50 upon the total qualifying gallons of neat biofuels sold in the respective calendar year by all such 51 eligible producers.

52 D. Any producer eligible to apply for a grant pursuant to this section shall provide evidence in the 53 form of production reports, satisfactory to the Director, that the producer met the neat biofuels 54 production requirements provided under this section for the respective calendar year. The producer shall 55 also provide evidence in the form of sales reports, satisfactory to the Director, of the number of 56 qualifying gallons of neat biofuels sold by the producer to customers in the respective calendar year.

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- Such reports shall be filed no later than March 31 following the calendar year in which the producer 57
- 58 sold the qualifying gallons of neat biofuels. Failure to meet the filing deadline shall render the applicant
- 59 ineligible to receive a grant. The postmark cancellation shall govern the date of the filing determination unless the Director has approved an alternative means of filing. 60
- No producer shall be eligible to receive grants pursuant to this section for qualifying sales made in 61 62 more than six calendar years.
- E. The Director shall certify to the Comptroller the grant amount a producer of neat biofuels is 63 eligible to receive in a given calendar year. Payments shall be paid by check issued by the State 64 65 Treasurer on warrant of the Comptroller.
- F. The Director, upon presenting appropriate credentials, may examine the records, books, invoices, 66 67 bills of lading, storage and production facilities, and other applicable documents to determine whether
- the production and sale of neat biofuels meet the requirements for grants as set forth in this section. 68
- 2. That no grant shall be paid pursuant to the provisions of this act for any neat biofuel sold on 70 or after January 1, 2017.
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
