4 5	Establishing a joint subcommittee to study long-term funding sources for the purchase of development
5	rights to preserve open-space land. Report.

10	WHEREAS, Article XI of the Constitution of Virginia states "to the end that the people have clean
11	air, pure water, and the use and enjoyment for recreation of adequate public lands, waters, and other
12	natural resources, it shall be the policy of the Commonwealth to conserve, develop, and utilize its
13	natural resources, its public lands, and its historical resources;" and
14 15	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth lost 490,000 acres of forestland between 1992 and 2000, lost
15 16	480,000 acres of cropland between 1982 and 1997, and lost 343,500 acres to development between 1992 and 1997; and
17	WHEREAS, 61% of the Commonwealth's environmentally sensitive natural areas are unprotected,
18	and 50% of the State's wetlands have been converted to other uses; and
19	WHEREAS, the benefits of land preservation include cleaner air and water, recreation opportunities
20 21	for citizens, preservation of working farms, protection of threatened species, and economic benefits of related businesses such as forming, the timber industry, and the fishing industry, as well as the accommis
22	related businesses such as farming, the timber industry, and the fishing industry, as well as the economic benefits of increased tourism; now, therefore, be it
23	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That a joint subcommittee be
24	established to study long-term funding sources for the purchase of development rights to preserve
25	open-space land. The joint subcommittee shall have a total membership of nine legislative members
26 27	appointed as follows: three members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules, and six members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates
28	in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of
29	Delegates. The joint subcommittee shall elect a chairman and vice chairman from among its
30	membership.
31 32	In conducting its study, the joint subcommittee shall review recent funding for the preservation of
32 33	open-space land, the future needs of the Commonwealth for open-space land, the cost of such needs, and long-term funding sources to pay the costs.
34	Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the House of Delegates.
35	Legal, research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint subcommittee shall be
36	provided by the Division of Legislative Services. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide
37 38	assistance to the joint subcommittee for this study, upon request. The joint subcommittee shall be limited to four meetings for the 2006 interim, and the direct costs of
<b>39</b>	this study shall not exceed \$9,000. Approval for unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require
40	the written authorization of the chairman of the joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk. If a
41	companion joint resolution of the other chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall
42 43	be required. No recommendation of the joint subcommittee shall be adopted if a majority of the Senate members
44	or a majority of the House members appointed to the joint subcommittee (i) vote against the
45	recommendation and (ii) vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the
46	joint subcommittee.
47 48	The joint subcommittee shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2006, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and
40 49	recommendations no later than the first day of the 2007 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The
50	executive summary shall state whether the joint subcommittee intends to submit to the General
51	Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or
52 53	Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Lagislative Automated Systems for the processing of lagislative documents and reports
55 54	the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
55	Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
56	Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or
57 59	delay the period for the conduct of the study, or authorize additional meetings during the year.
