## **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 225**

6	WHEREAS, Howard D. Kahn, O.D., respected optometrist and lifelong advisor to the Virginia Beach
7	Volunteer Rescue Squad, Inc., died on March 21, 2005; and

8 WHEREAS, after achieving the rank of lieutenant junior grade in the United States Navy during
9 World War II, Howard Kahn left the military to begin his practice of optometry in Virginia Beach in
10 1951; and

WHEREAS, in his practice of optometry, Dr. Kahn was a pioneer and leader of the specialty of
 developmental vision and vision therapy, helping hundreds of patients who were thought to have
 learning disabilities overcome their visual deficiencies; and

WHEREAS, the nonsurgical techniques Dr. Kahn developed to straighten eyes that were crossed andto improve vision in eyes labeled "lazy" are still used successfully today; and

16 WHEREAS, Dr. Kahn was an author and lecturer and well respected by students, parents, teachers,17 and administrators for his ability to diagnose and remediate vision-related learning disorders; and

18 WHEREAS, Dr. Kahn served as president of the Virginia Optometric Association, received its
 19 Optometrist of the Year honor, and also received the Virginia Optometric Association's Lifetime
 20 Achievement Award; and

WHEREAS, one of Dr. Kahn's proudest achievements was his valuable role in the founding of the
 Virginia Beach Volunteer Rescue Squad; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Kahn was chairman of the Virginia Beach Rescue Squad Advisory Board and a
 member of the Board of the Virginia Beach Rescue Squad Foundation; and

WHEREAS, in 1952 Dr. Kahn taught the initial first aid course to the charter members of the
 Virginia Beach Volunteer Rescue Squad, enabling them to meet state standards; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Beach Volunteer Rescue Squad honored Dr. Kahn with a life membership
for his commitment and outstanding service to the rescue squad and the citizens of Virginia Beach; now,
therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby
 note with great sadness the passing of an outstanding public servant and fine Virginia gentlemen, Dr.
 Howard D. Kahn; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution
 for presentation to the family of Dr. Howard D. Kahn as an expression of the respect in which his
 memory is held by the members of the General Assembly.
