| 11 | WHEREAS, buildings designed and constructed with energy efficient and sustainable principles help |
| 12 13 | to reduce the Commonwealth's energy demand; and WHEPEAS a reduction in anomy demand hanefits the aitizane of the Commonwealth by reducing |
| 13 14 | WHEREAS, a reduction in energy demand benefits the citizens of the Commonwealth by reducing the amount of pollution amitted from power plants in the Commonwealth and may help offset the paed |

| 15 16 | WHEREAS, design and construction of buildings that meet the energy efficiency and sustainable |
| 17 | design requirements for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification require a |
| 18 | greater initial investment on the part of the owner of the building; and |
| 19 | WHEREAS, offering localities the option of reducing the real estate tax liability for those individuals |
| 20 | and entities that design and construct buildings that meet the LEED certification requirements would |

| 22 | RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Virginia Coal and Energy |
| 23 | Commission be directed to study potential legislation authorizing a locality to provide for a real estate |
| 24 | tax break for buildings constructed in compliance with Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design |
| 25 | standards. |
| 26 | In conducting its study, the Virginia Coal and Energy Commission shall (i) review the certification |
| 27 | procedures for meeting LEED requirements for sustainable building design and construction, (ii) identify |
| 28 | the taxable entities that would qualify for preferential tax treatment for obtaining LEED certification in |
| 29 | new and existing buildings, and (iii) identify the appropriate amount and type of tax relief that would |
| 30 | best provide an incentive for and reward individuals and other entities that chose to meet LEED |
| 31 | certification requirements. |
| 32 | The Office of the Clerk of the House of Delegates shall provide administrative staff support. The |
| 33 | Division of Legislative Services shall provide legal, research, policy analysis, and other services as |
| 34 35 | requested by the Virginia Coal and Energy Commission. Technical assistance shall be provided to the Virginia Coal and Energy Commission by the Department of Minor Minorals and Energy All agencies |
| 35 36 | Virginia Coal and Energy Commission by the Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Virginia Coal and Energy Commission for this |
| 37 | study, upon request. |
| 38 | The Virginia Coal and Energy Commission shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2006, and |
| | the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of |
| 40 | its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2007 Regular Session of the General |
| 41 | Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether the Virginia Coal and Energy Commission |
| 42 | intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and |
| 43 | recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report |
| 44 | shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for |
| 45 | the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's |
| 46 | website. |
