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## **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 97**

AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

(Proposed by the House Committee on Rules

on February 8, 2006)

(Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Landes)

Requesting the Department of Medical Assistance Services and the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission to monitor changes in federal restrictions on sheltering assets to qualify for Medicaid long-term care services. Report.

WHEREAS, House Bill 2601 (2005) was introduced to allow the Department of Medical Assistance Q Services to seek a waiver of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. 1315, § 1115, to create more restrictive 11 asset transfer limits than those currently allowed under federal law or regulations; and

WHEREAS, the introduction of House Bill 2601 raised a variety of issues related to individuals 12 disposing of assets to gain access to Medicaid long-term care services; and 13

14 WHEREAS, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission completed a study over a decade ago entitled Medicaid Asset Transfers and Estate Recovery Senate Document 10 (1993) that addressed 15 the impact of Medicaid asset transfers in Virginia; and 16

17 WHEREAS, the federal Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993 imposed additional restrictions on Medicaid asset transfers after the conclusion of the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission 18 19 study; and

20 WHEREAS, the Joint Commission on Health Care, in response to Commission member requests, 21 conducted a review of Medicaid asset transfer issues and found that other than anecdotal evidence, 22 current data is not available on the extent of Medicaid asset transfer abuses in Virginia; and 23

WHEREAS, federal legislation has been proposed to reform Medicaid asset transfer rules; and

24 WHEREAS, states have primary responsibility for enforcement of Medicaid asset transfer limitations; 25 and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Medical Assistance Services is the state agency charged with the administration of Medicaid funds and determining eligibility; now, therefore, be it

28 RESOLVED by the House, the Senate concurring, That the Department of Medical Assistance 29 Services and the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission be requested to monitor changes in 30 federal restrictions on sheltering assets to qualify for Medicaid long-term care services.

31 For the purpose of advising the General Assembly and the Governor, the Department of Medical 32 Assistance Services and the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall monitor pending 33 federal legislation concerning Medicaid asset transfers to (i) evaluate the potential impact of proposed 34 changes in federal law and their correlation to Virginia law; (ii) ascertain reports and analyses prepared 35 in connection with the proposed federal legislation; (iii) review the practice by which persons transfer, 36 convert, give away, or otherwise shelter assets to become eligible for Medicaid long-term care services; 37 (iv) recommend options available to limit the financial impact of sheltering assets for Medicaid 38 qualification on the Commonwealth upon the passage of any such federal legislation; and (v) apprise the General Assembly concerning any changes in state law regarding asset sheltering that may be necessary. 39

40 Technical assistance shall be provided to the Department of Medical Assistance Services and the 41 Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission, to accomplish the objectives of this resolution, by the Departments of Social Services and Taxation. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide 42 assistance to the Department of Medical Assistance Services and the Joint Legislative Audit and Review 43 44 Commission, upon request.

The Commissioner of the Department of Medical Assistance Services and the Chairman of the Joint 45 Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall jointly submit to the Division of Legislative Automated 46 47 Systems an executive summary and report of their progress in meeting the requests of this resolution no later than the first day of 2007 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary and **48** report shall be submitted for publication as a report document as provided in the procedures of the 49 Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and 50 51 shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

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
