3	Recognizing Czechoslovakian-Americans and their descendants in Virginia.

8	WHEREAS, one of Virginia's first railroads was constructed in Prince George County in the
9	mid-1800s; steam locomotives required whistle stops along the line, and the first stop built east of
10	Petersburg, near the intersection of Rives and Quaker Roads, was named Wells Station; and
11	WHEREAS, at a time after the American Civil War when the agricultural economy of the State had
12	drastically declined, a wave of European immigrants, mostly Czech families from the provinces of
13	Bohemia and Moravia, settled near Wells Station; and
14	WHEREAS, by the turn of the 20th century, a schoolhouse, hotel, store, a small railroad depot, and a
15	number of churches had emerged in Wells Station and the number of Czech-Americans swelled into the
16	thousands; and
17	WHEREAS, an earnest people possessing old world vocations and values, Czech immigrants
18	established prosperous businesses and productive farms; and
19	WHEREAS, the Czech community has played a vital role in the history of Virginia, particularly in
20	the growth and stability of Prince George County, where the whistle stop at Wells Station was renamed
<b>2</b> 1	New Bohemia in honor of the industrious people living there; and
22	WHEREAS, many existing Czech farms, which have been in the same family for well over 100
23	years are honored as Century Farms of Virginia; and
24	WHEREAS, Sacred Heart Catholic Church, the oldest Czech Catholic Church in Virginia and
25	perhaps the nation, will celebrate its 100th anniversary in 2006; and
26	WHEREAS, although Czechoslovakian-Americans live throughout the Commonwealth, New Bohemia
27	in Prince George County, the homeplace of Virginia's first Czech families, is in the midst of drastic
28	demographic change and economic development; the whistle stop of Wells Station will soon be the site
29	of a large intermodal facility with truck stops, hotels, and housing developments displacing what used to
30	be Czech farmland; and
31	WHEREAS, only remnants of the once flourishing New Bohemia exist today, and what remains of
32	the historic community is in danger of being lost in the tide of new development; now, therefore, be it
33	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, That Czechoslovakian-Americans and their descendants in
34	Virginia be recognized in order to preserve and honor their contributions as an integral part of the early
35	history and culture of the Commonwealth; and, be it
36	RESOLVED FURTHER. That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit a conv of this resolution

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit a copy of this resolution
to Marie V. Pearson, co-founder, and Joyce Pritchard of the Southside Virginia Czech/Slovak Heritage
Society, requesting that they further disseminate copies of this resolution to their respective constituents
so that they may be apprised of the sense of the General Assembly of Virginia in this matter.
