6	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 33.1 a chapter numbered 10.2, consisting of
7	sections numbered 33.1-391.6 through 33.1-391.9; and to repeal Chapter 1041 of the Acts of
8	Assembly of 2003, relating to the TransDominion Express Authority.
9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 33.1 a chapter numbered 10.2,
11	consisting of sections numbered 33.1-391.6 through 33.1-391.9, as follows:
12	CHAPTER 10.2.
13	TRANSDOMINION EXPRESS AUTHORITY.
14	§ 33.1-391.6. Short title.
15 16	This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the TransDominion Express Authority Act.
10	§ 33.1-391.7. Authority created; purpose.
17	There is hereby created a body corporate and a political subdivision of the Commonwealth to be known as the TransDominion Express Authority, hereinafter in this chapter known as "the Authority."
19	The Authority shall have the responsibility within the TransDominion corridor of identifying needed
20	construction, reconstruction, improvements, repairs, extensions, additions, restorations, and any related
2 0 2 1	acquisitions of real or personal property, of or to rails, tracks, rights-of-way, shops, terminals, bridges,
$\overline{22}$	tunnels, rolling stock, signals, and any other equipment, infrastructure, or facilities that are or may be
23	used to provide for the transportation of passengers by rail in coordination with freight rail in the
24	Commonwealth that the Authority determines to be in the public interest, hereinafter referred to as a
25	rail transportation project. In addition to its other powers hereinafter set forth, the Authority shall have
26	the power to finance or assist in financing, from the resources made available to it, any such rail
27	transportation project. For purposes of this chapter, the TransDominion corridor shall be defined
28	generally as the intercity rail corridor from Bristol through Roanoke and Lynchburg and including
29	branches extending from Lynchburg to Richmond and from Lynchburg to Washington D.C. through
30	Charlottesville and including communities adjacent thereto and to such other destinations as the
31	Authority may deem appropriate.
32	§ 33.1-391.8. Composition of Authority; chairman and vice-chairman; quorum; administrative
33 34	support services. The Authority shall consist of nine voting members from the TransDominion Express service area
35	appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by the General Assembly, who shall serve for terms
33 36	of four years and may be reappointed for one additional term.
37	For the initial appointments only, four of the appointments may be for terms of two years so as to
38	allow for staggered terms. Such initial two-year terms shall not count against the term limitation.
39	Vacancies shall be filled by gubernatorial appointment for any unexpired term.
40	The Authority shall annually elect from its membership a chairman and vice-chairman, who shall
41	continue to hold such office until their respective successors are elected. Five members of the Authority
42	shall constitute a quorum.
43	The members of the Authority shall be reimbursed their actual and necessary expenses incurred in
44	carrying out their duties and, in addition, shall be paid the same per diem as provided in the general
45	appropriation act for members of the General Assembly engaged in legislative business between
46	sessions.
47	§ 33.1-391.9. Powers of Authority.
48	The Authority shall have the following powers together with all powers incidental thereto or
49 50	necessary for the performance of those hereinafter stated:
50 51	1. To sue and be sued and to prosecute and defend, at law or in equity, in any court having jurisdiction of the subject matter and of the parties;
51 52	2. To adopt and use a corporate seal and to alter the same at pleasure;
5 <u>7</u>	3. To procure insurance, participate in insurance plans, and provide self-insurance; however, the
54	purchase of insurance, participation in an insurance plan, or the creation of a self-insurance plan by
55	the Authority shall not be deemed a waiver or relinquishment of any sovereign immunity to which the
56	Authority or its officers, directors, employees, or agents are otherwise entitled;
57	4. To establish bylaws and make all rules and regulations, not inconsistent with the provisions of this
58	chapter, deemed expedient for the management of the Authority's affairs;
59	5. To apply for and accept money, materials, contributions, grants, or other financial assistance from

the United States and agencies or instrumentalities thereof, the Commonwealth, or any political 60 subdivision, agency, or instrumentality of the Commonwealth; 61

6. To make loans or grants for purposes that are consistent with this chapter and otherwise to 62 63 receive and expend moneys on behalf of the Authority;

64 7. To acquire real and personal property or any interest therein by purchase, lease, gift, or otherwise, and to hold, encumber, sell, or otherwise dispose of such land or interest, for purposes 65 66 consistent with this chapter; 67

8. To construct or acquire, by purchase, lease, contract, or otherwise, rail transportation facilities;

9. To enter into agreements or leases with public or private entities for the operation of rail 68 transportation facilities it has acquired; 69

70 10. To make and execute contracts and all other instruments and agreements necessary or convenient 71 for the performance of its duties and the exercise of its powers and functions under this chapter;

11. To the extent funds are made available to the Authority to do so, to employ employees, agents, 72 advisors, and consultants, including without limitation, attorneys, financial advisers, engineers, and 73 other technical advisers and, the provisions of any other law to the contrary notwithstanding, to 74 75 determine their duties and compensation;

76 12. To establish and collect fees, charges, or other revenue for the use of the property, equipment, or 77 facilities of the Authority, and to pledge such fees, charges, or other revenues to service debt authorized 78 under this Act: and

79 13. To the extent not inconsistent with other provisions of this chapter, and without limiting or 80 restricting the powers otherwise given the Authority, to exercise all the powers given to transportation 81 district commissions by § 15.2-4518, except the right to exercise the power of eminent domain.

Any Authority operating within the Virginia Railway Express service area shall coordinate all train 82 operations with the Virginia Railway Express and any affected local jurisdiction. 83

No provision of this chapter shall be construed as authorizing the Authority to (i) impose fees, 84 85 financial obligations, or mandates of any kind on any common carrier freight railroad without the express consent of the common carrier railroad or (ii) exercise the power of eminent domain. 86

2. That Chapter 1041 of the Acts of Assembly of 2003 is repealed. 87
